32	Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950.

Any such employee 27 may be reemployed at any time after his resignation or retirement, but he shall be 28 gualified for the position to which he is reemployed. In addition, the employee shall 29 be reemployed with the seniority accumulated through the date of reinstatement; 30 however, a regular employee shall be reemployed as provided in this Paragraph only if his resignation or retirement occurred as a result of the employee being unable to 31 32 perform the essential functions of his job upon sustaining an injury."
