OR SEE FISC NOTE Page 1 of 1 LABOR DISPUTES Provides relative to labor organizations and labor disputes. (8/1/14)

Proposed law defines "mass picketing" and prohibits mass picketing if it hinders a person from pursing lawful employment, obstructs a business premises, obstructs the free and uninterrupted use of public transportation, or takes place on private property of an employer without permission. Proposed law provides that a business or employer subjected to picketing that is prohibited may bring action in a court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin the activity (no bond required). Proposed law provides fines and penalties of up to \$1,000 per day that a person violates a court order. Proposed law provides fines and penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for labor organization that assists in prohibited picketing. Proposed law provides all fines and penalties shall be paid in to the registry of the court. Proposed law provides that a person adversely affected by

prohibited picketing may be compensated from the penalties paid into the registry. Proposed law provides that if no claim is filed against penalties in the registry within a year, the court shall use the funds in the administration of the court. Proposed law is effective August 1, 2014.

The Legislative Fiscal Office cannot determine the number of enjoined suits that would be filed or violation determined as a result of this measure.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

Change {S&H}

The proposed legislation may result in an indeterminable increase in self-generated revenues associated with fine collections. This measure allows the courts to subject a person that engages in prohibited picketing a fine of up to \$1,000 each day of the violation. In addition, a labor organization that assists in prohibited picketing shall be subject to a fine of up to \$10,00 each day of the violation. All fines shall be deposited into the registry of the court. After one year, if any funds are left over after damages are paid, fines deposited into the registry of the court shall be deposited into the general fund of the court for use in the administration of the court.
