SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 147

LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT. Requests the Department of Education to study the feasibility of establishing a Louisiana high school athletic agency within the department to administer high school intrastate interscholastic athletics.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Department of Education to study the feasibility of establishing a
3	Louisiana high school athletic agency within the department to administer high
4	school intrastate interscholastic athletics.
5	WHEREAS, the Louisiana High School Athletic Association was formed by a group
6	of principals in 1920 to regulate high school interscholastic athletics; and
7	WHEREAS, the association is currently composed of approximately three hundred
8	ninety member schools, of which almost eighty percent are public institutions; and
9	WHEREAS, the principals of the public schools are public employees; and
10	WHEREAS, the principals of the public schools are members of the association by
11	virtue of their public employment; and
12	WHEREAS, many private school members receive state funding through the
13	Educational Excellence Fund, required services, lunch programs, and school transportation;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, nearly ninety thousand Louisiana students annually participate in
16	athletics; and
17	WHEREAS, the state has a compelling interest in protecting the due process rights
18	of its citizens and institutions; and

1	WHEREAS, until recently, the association was considered to be a quasi-public entity,
2	until the association sued the state of Louisiana over a legislative audit (LHSAA v. State of
3	Louisiana, 107 So.3d 583 (La 2013)); and
4	WHEREAS, despite the state's compelling interest in interscholastic athletics
5	conducted for its citizens and the association's membership being comprised of an
6	overwhelming super majority of public employees, the Louisiana Supreme Court found that
7	the association was a private corporation, not subject to the Open Meetings Law, and not
8	subject to legislative audits; and
9	WHEREAS, the association has come under great scrutiny over several eligibility
10	matters and the alleged lack of due process in its proceedings; and
11	WHEREAS, since the state of Louisiana has such a compelling interest in the fair
12	disposition of proceedings for its citizens and institutions, it may be in everyone's best
13	interests to have high school intrastate interscholastic athletics administered by a state
14	agency.
15	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
16	does hereby urge and request the Department of Education to study the feasibility of
17	establishing a Louisiana high school athletic agency within the department to administer
18	high school intrastate interscholastic athletics.
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department report its findings in writing to
20	the Senate Committee on Education not later than February 1, 2015.
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the executive
22	director of the Louisiana High School Athletic Association and the state superintendent of
