A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Environmental Protection Agency and the United States Department
3	of Agriculture to complete the approval process for certain new weed control system
4	products.
5	WHEREAS, American farmers play a pivotal role in providing food and fiber for the
6	world's population; and
7	WHEREAS, the world's population is estimated to exceed nine billion by the year
8	2050; and
9	WHEREAS, the United Nations predicts that the global demand for food, feed and
10	fiber will nearly double in the next forty years as population grows; and
11	WHEREAS, farmers are finding it harder to stay competitive in the marketplace
12	given economic and environmental challenges, including weed resistance; and
13	WHEREAS, farmers must utilize innovative technologies to help them stay
14	competitive while meeting food demands in a sustainable manner; and
15	WHEREAS, through the new Enlist Weed Control System, Dow Agrosciences has
16	introduced a product that provides exceptional weed control while increasing the overall
17	productivity and efficiency of farming operations; and
18	WHEREAS, delays in access to new products can lead to soil loss, water waste and

increased fuel costs on farms; and

Department of Agriculture started the review process five years ago, these innovative

products have not received regulatory approval and remain unavailable to American farmers;

and

WHEREAS, Canadian authorities have already approved the new weed control system perhaps putting American and Louisiana farmers at a competitive disadvantage; and

WHEREAS, new systems, such as the Enlist Weed Control System, provide longterm sustainability through innovative education and training programs, research and development efforts, technology improvements and in-field performance testing; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana farmers need access to the newest innovative products in order to compete in the global marketplace.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Environmental Protection Agency and the United States Department of Agriculture to complete the approval process for certain new weed control system products.
