9	Section 1. R.S. 33:1992(A)(1) and 2002(A)(3)(a) are hereby amended and reenacted

11	§1992. Minimum salaries
12	A. The minimum monthly salaries of firemen in municipalities having a
13	population of twelve thousand or more and in the city of Bastrop and of all parish
14	and fire protection district paid firemen, including salaries payable out of the avails
15	of any special tax provided by the Constitution of Louisiana for increasing the pay
16	of firemen, shall be in accordance with the following schedule, and such salaries
17	shall be paid semi-monthly not later than the fifth and twentieth day of each calendar
18	month:
19	(1) A fireman shall receive a minimum monthly salary of four hundred
20	dollars per month based on a regular hourly rate of pay compliant with the Fair
21	Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. 201 et seq. This salary shall be exclusive of
22	supplemental pay received pursuant to R.S. 33:2002.
