POSTSECONDARY ED. Provides relative to the regional distribution of postsecondary institutions and educational services. (gov sig)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3126, relative to postsecondary education; to provide relative
3	to the regional distribution of postsecondary educational institutions within the state;
4	to provide relative to the evaluation and use of instructional and physical resources
5	within each region; to provide for a report of findings and recommendations; to make
6	technical changes; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 17:3126 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
9	§3126. Power to disapprove; approve; or modify; service regions, establishment;
10	<u>evaluation</u>
11	A. The Board of Regents shall have the power to approve, disapprove, or
12	modify a proposed degree program, department of instruction, division, or similar
13	subdivision.
14	B. No college or university postsecondary educational institution may
15	institute a new degree program or department of instruction, division, or similar
16	subdivision without the final approval of the Board of Regents.
17	C.(1) In exercising its power pursuant to this Section regarding program

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1approval of institutions under the jurisdiction managementof the Board of2Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges, the Board of Regents shall3include in any such consideration the need for broad citizen student4education and training services provided by such institutions and shall endeavor to5expand such access through use of all available resources, including programs which6are provided through electronic transmission online.

(2) The Board of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges shall
determine the feasibility of establishing a means of awarding associate degrees and
certificates below the rank of baccalaureate by using the instructional resources of
existing postsecondary institutions. The Board of Supervisors of Community and
Technical Colleges may award such degrees, provided that the board and the Board
of Regents agree that such awards are feasible and advantageous to the citizens of
Louisiana and that sufficient appropriations are available for this purpose.

(3) The provision of any program subject to the supervision and management
of and offered at any an institution under the jurisdiction management of the Board
of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges which is not a degree program
shall require no approval beyond that of the Board of Community and Technical
Colleges.

19(4) The Board of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges, with20the approval of the Board of Regents, may enter into agreements or contract with the21**management** board having supervision and management of any public institution22of higher **postsecondary** education for the provision by any such institution of23courses and services leading to an associate degree offered by the Board of24Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges.

25 D.(1) The Board of Regents shall formulate and establish geographic regions 26 of the state in order to maximize the use of the instructional and physical resources 27 of existing state **public** postsecondary educational institutions and regionally 28 accredited independent postsecondary educational institutions and to provide broad 29 citizen <u>student</u> access to the education and training services provided by such

The board shall establish the regions such <u>In establishing the regions</u>, <u>the board shall ensure</u> that at least one public institution of higher <u>postsecondary</u> education which awards baccalaureate degrees shall be <u>is located</u> within the geographic boundaries of, or shall be <u>is</u> assigned by the Board of Regents to, each region.

(2)(a) The Board of Regents shall evaluate the instructional and physical 6 7 resources of such the existing postsecondary educational institutions within each 8 region, including the resources of existing higher education institutions, and shall 9 assure maximum use thereof before ensure the optimal use of resources within 10 and outside of a region prior to recommending the creation of any new 11 postsecondary institution within the a region. The Board of Regents may provide for 12 the use within a region of existing resources from outside the region before 13 recommending the creation of any new postsecondary institution within the region.

14 (b) Such This evaluation shall also be used by the board to create 15 efficiencies, increase student access, enhance academic quality, further the goals 16 established by the master plan for postsecondary education, and for any other 17 purpose that will serve to advance postsecondary education in each region and the 18 state as a whole.

19(c)(i) The board shall determine if a region is over-served or under-20served by the postsecondary educational institutions within the region and shall21consider whether any of the following would increase the efficiency and22effectiveness of the delivery of public postsecondary educational services within23a region:

(aa) The merger of two or more existing postsecondary institutions. (bb) Converting a nondegree granting postsecondary institution to an institution which grants degrees.

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 (cc) Converting a college or university which is limited to offering

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 degrees of a lower rank than baccalaureate to a college or university that offers

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 baccalaureate degrees.

6	(ff) Closure of a postsecondary educational institution.	
7	(d) With the exception of those matters enumerated in Article VIII, Section	
8	5 of the Constitution of Louisiana that require legislative approval, the Board of	
9	Regents shall adopt such policies and take such actions deemed appropriate and	
10	necessary to maximize the use of all resources available to support and promote	
11	postsecondary education in the state.	
12	E. The Board of Regents shall submit a written report of its findings and	
13	recommendations to the Senate Committee on Education and the House	
14	Committee on Education not later than January 30, 2016.	
15	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not	
16	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature	
17	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If	
18	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become	
19	effective on the day following such approval.

Proposed law makes technical changes to present law.

<u>Present law</u> requires the Board of Regents (board) to formulate and establish geographic regions of the state in order to maximize the use of the instructional and physical resources of existing state postsecondary educational institutions and regionally accredited independent postsecondary educational institutions. Further requires the board to establish the regions such that at least one public institution of higher education which awards baccalaureate degrees shall be within the geographic boundaries of, or shall be assigned by the board to, each region.

Proposed law retains these provisions.

Present law requires the board to evaluate the instructional and physical resources of existing

Provides that the board may provide for the use within a region of existing resources from outside the region before recommending the creation of any new postsecondary institution within the region. Further provides that the evaluation be used to create efficiencies, increase student access, enhance academic quality, further the goals of the master plan for postsecondary education, and any other purpose that advances postsecondary education in each region or the state as a whole.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the board to determine if a region is over-served or under-served by the postsecondary educational institutions within the region and consider whether any of the following would increase the efficiency and effectiveness of the delivery of public postsecondary educational services within a region:

- (1) The merger of two or more existing postsecondary institutions.
- (2) Converting a nondegree granting postsecondary institution to an institution which grants degrees.
- (3) Converting a college or university which is limited to offering degrees of a lower rank than baccalaureate to a college or university that offers baccalaureate degrees.
- (4) Converting a college or university which offers baccalaureate degrees to a college or university that is limited to offering degrees of a lower rank.
- (5) Transferring a college or university from one postsecondary management board to another.
- (6) Closure of a postsecondary educational institution.

<u>Present law</u> requires the board to adopt such policies and take such actions deemed appropriate and necessary to maximize the use of all resources available to support and promote postsecondary education in the state, with the exception of those matters enumerated in Article VIII, Section 5 of the Constitution of Louisiana that require legislative approval.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the board to submit a written report of its findings and recommendations to the Senate and House committees on education not later than January 30, 2016.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
