Requires criminal justice agencies to annually report certain information concerning sexual assault kits and sexually-oriented criminal offenses. (gov sig)

Proposed law requires each crime laboratory to report the number of sexual assault collection kits in their backlog and each criminal justice agency, including college and university campus police departments, to report the following information for the preceding calendar year no later than February 15th of each year: 1) the number of sexually-oriented criminal offenses reported, 2) the number of sexually-oriented criminal offenses investigated, and 3) the number of sexual assault collection kits submitted for analysis, 4) the number of reported sexual assault collection kits requiring analysis, 5) the number of reported sexual assault collection kits received, 6) the number of unreported sexual assault collection kits received, 7) the number of reported sexual assault collection kits that were untested due to judicial or investigative reasons, 8) written notification if proposed law is not applicable to the criminal justice agency or department. Proposed law requires the LA Commission on Law Enforcement to transmit the information required to the chairmen of the Senate Committee on Judiciary B and the House Committee on Judiciary by March 1st of each year.

**EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

The proposed legislation will result in a minimal increase in state general fund expenditures as a result of collecting sexual assault information. The LA Commission on Law Enforcement anticipates a minimal fiscal impact (\$7,000 - \$10,000) as a result of collecting and submitting the information required by the proposed legislation. The increase will be absorbed using current resources.

The Louisiana Sheriff's Association and Louisiana Chief's of Police Association have indicated that the local law enforcement agencies would be able to report the required information at no additional cost.

**REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
