### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 109

### BY SENATOR WALSWORTH

COMMENDATIONS. Recognizes May 27, 2015, as Alzheimer's Awareness Day at the state capitol and expresses the continued support of the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force's Final Report.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To recognize May 27, 2015, as "Alzheimer's Awareness Day" at the state capitol and
3	expresses the continued support of the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force's
4	Final Report and the implementation of its recommendations.
5	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is a fatal degenerative disease of the brain that
6	impairs cognitive function, memory, and behavior; and
7	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is not a normal part of the aging process; and
8	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth leading cause of death in the United
9	States, and the fifth leading cause of death for those over sixty-five years of age; and
10	WHEREAS, over five million people nationwide have Alzheimer's disease, including
11	approximately eighty-two thousand Louisianians; and
12	WHEREAS, nearly one in every three seniors dies each year with Alzheimer's
13	disease; and
14	WHEREAS, in 2012, one thousand five hundred five deaths resulted from
15	Alzheimer's disease in Louisiana; and
16	WHEREAS, the total cost of care nationally for individuals with Alzheimer's disease
17	is expected to soar from two hundred twenty-six billion dollars in 2015 to over one trillion
18	dollars in the year 2050; and

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1	WHEREAS, nationally, the average per person's Medicaid spending for seniors with
2	Alzheimer's disease and other dementia is nineteen times higher than the average per
3	person's Medicaid spending for all other seniors; and
4	WHEREAS, in 2014, two hundred thirty thousand family caregivers in Louisiana
5	provided 262,000,000 hours of unpaid Alzheimer's care, valued at over three billion dollars;
6	and
7	WHEREAS, only forty-five percent of people with Alzheimer's disease or their
8	caregivers report being told of their diagnosis; and
9	WHEREAS, nearly eighty percent of Louisiana seniors who reported experiencing
10	confusion or memory loss happening more often or getting worse have not talked with a
11	health care professional about it; and
12	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease takes a tremendous emotional toll on all whose
13	lives it touches, including family members, friends, and especially the caregivers of those
14	living with Alzheimer's disease; and
15	WHEREAS, more than sixty percent of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers are
16	women; and
17	WHEREAS, in 2008, the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force was established
18	by the legislature; and
19	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force was comprised of
20	membership from the legislature, as well as defined representatives from interested
21	community and industry partners; and
22	WHEREAS, the task force, in accordance with its legislative charge, accomplished
23	the following: assessed the current and future impact of Alzheimer's disease on Louisianians;
24	examined the existing industries, services, and resources addressing the needs of persons
25	with Alzheimer's disease, their families and caregivers; developed a strategy to mobilize a
26	state response to Alzheimer's disease; held public meetings and utilized technological means
27	to gather feedback from persons and families affected by Alzheimer's disease; submitted a
28	report of findings and recommendations to the legislature and the governor in the form of
29	a state Alzheimer's disease plan in October of 2009; and
30	WHEREAS, recommendations from the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force

Final Report covered the following areas: infrastructure, data collection, education and 1 2 training, early detection and diagnosis, safety, services and facilities, and health coverage. 3 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby recognize May 27, 2015, as "Alzheimer's Awareness Day" at the state capitol and expresses 4 their continued support of the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force's Final Report and 5 6 expresses the renewed implementation of the Louisiana Alzheimer's Disease Task Force's 7 Final Report, in partnership with the Department of Health and Hospitals and the 8 Alzheimer's Association Louisiana chapter. 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that implementation of the task force report will 10 move Louisiana closer to becoming a dementia-capable state, better suited to handle the 11 fiscal, psychological, and social demands Alzheimer's disease places on Louisiana families. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the 12 13 Department of Health and Hospitals and the Alzheimer's Association Louisiana chapter.
