APPROPRIATIONS/SUPPLEML: Supplemental appropriations and reductions in appropriations for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 (Item #1)

1 AN ACT

2 To appropriate funds and to make and otherwise provide for certain reductions in
3 appropriations from certain sources to be allocated to designated agencies and
4 purposes in specific amounts for the making of supplemental appropriations and
5 reductions for said agencies and purposes for the 2015-2016 Fiscal Year; to provide
6 for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

8 Section 1.A. The commissioner of administration is authorized and directed to
9 reduce the State General Fund by Fees and Self-generated Revenues appropriations
10 contained in Act 16 of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature for the following

1 Provided, however, that the reduction to the Minimum Foundation Program shall not affect
2 the appropriations out of the Minimum Foundation Program required by Senate Concurrent
3 Resolution 55 of the 2014 Regular Session of the Legislature.

4 Be it further provided that the commissioner of administration is authorized and directed to
5 adjust the appropriations and means of financing contained in Act 16 of the 2016 Regular
6 Session for the Minimum Foundation Program to direct all appropriations out of the Lottery
7 Proceeds Fund to fund the appropriations required by Senate Concurrent Resolution 55 of
8 the 2014 Regular Session of the Legislature.

9 Section 2. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer monies
10 from the State General Fund by Fees and Self-generated Revenues from the Department of
11 Veterans Affairs in the amount of \$5,100,000 into the State General Fund (Direct).

12 Section 3. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the secretary of the
13 Department of Health and Hospitals shall not take any action that would result in reductions
14 to or elimination of the Pediatric Day Health Care Program.

15 Section 4. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state treasurer
16 is hereby authorized and directed to transfer to the State General Fund (Direct) the amounts
17 of any reduction in State General Fund by Fees and Self-generated Revenues, Statutory
18 Dedications, or Interagency Transfers reduced as provided or recognized in this Act, by
19 Executive Orders, and by the approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.
20 The state treasurer shall make such transfers from each fund prior to fully funding the
21 appropriation from the fund.

22 Section 5. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
23 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
24 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
25 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
26 effective on the day following such approval.
