Colomb

Present law prohibits a person from operating a motor vehicle upon any public road or highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to write, send, or read a text-based communication. Present law further provides that a first violation of present law is punishable by a fine of up to \$175, and each subsequent violation is punishable by a fine of up to \$500.

Proposed law makes a first violation of present law punishable by a fine of up to \$500, and each subsequent violation punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000. Proposed law otherwise retains present law.

Present law prohibits a person who holds a Class "E" learner's license or intermediate license under present law from operating a motor vehicle on any public road or highway of this state while using any wireless telecommunications device to engage in a call, unless the wireless telecommunications device is a hands-free wireless telephone. Present law further provides that a first violation of present law is punishable by a fine of up to \$175, and each subsequent violation is punishable by a fine of up to \$500.

Proposed law makes a first violation of present law punishable by a fine of up to \$500, and each subsequent violation punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000. Proposed law otherwise retains present law.

Present law provides that, except in a driver emergency, no person 17 years of age or younger can operate a motor vehicle on any public road or highway in this state while using any wireless telecommunications device to engage in a call or write, send or read a text-based communication. Present law further provides that a first violation of present law is punishable by a fine of up to \$100, and each subsequent violation is punishable by a fine of up to \$250.

Proposed law makes a first violation of present law punishable by a fine of up to \$250, and each subsequent violation punishable by a fine of up to \$500. Proposed law otherwise retains present law.

Present law prohibits a person from using any wireless telecommunications device while operating a motor vehicle upon any public road or highway during the posted hours within a school zone on a public road or highway. Present law further provides that a first violation of present law is punishable by a fine of up to \$175, and each subsequent violation is punishable by a fine of up to \$500.

Proposed law makes a first violation of present law punishable by a fine of up to \$500, and each subsequent violation punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000. Proposed law otherwise retains present law.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
