Chabert

<u>Present law</u> requires a retail seafood dealer's license for anyone buying, acquiring, or handling any species of fish, whether fresh, frozen, processed, or unprocessed that sells to a consumer for personal or household use or any person who ships for personal or household use.

<u>Present law</u> exempts from the retail seafood dealer's license requirement restaurants and retail grocers who purchase fish from a licensed wholesale/retail dealer and only sell such fish fully prepared by cooking for immediate consumption.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>, except only requires the fish be fully prepared to qualify for the exemption and removes the cooking requirement.

Effective August 1, 2016.
