COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS: Provides relative to the dissolution of limited liability companies

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 12:1335.1(A), relative to the dissolution by affidavit of a limited
3 liability company; to provide for such dissolution if the limited liability company
4 does not own immovable property; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 12:1335.1(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

7 §1335.1. Dissolution by affidavit

8 A. In addition to all other methods of dissolution, if a limited liability
9 company is no longer doing business, ~~and~~ owes no debts, and owns no immovable
10 property, it may be dissolved by filing an affidavit with the secretary of state
11 executed by the members or by the organizer, if no membership interests have been
12 issued, attesting to such facts and requesting that the limited liability company be
13 dissolved. Thereafter, the members, or the organizer if no membership interests have
14 been issued, shall be personally liable for any debts or other claims against the
15 limited liability company in proportion to their ownership interest in the company.

Abstract: Authorizes the dissolution by affidavit of a limited liability company that owns no immovable property.

Present law authorizes a limited liability company's dissolution by affidavit if the limited liability company is no longer doing business and owes no debts. Proposed law retains present law.

Proposed law further authorizes a limited liability company to dissolve by affidavit if the limited liability company does not own immovable property.
