11	that he was much more interested in serving his country with military service and in 2005

13	WHEREAS, Johnny found the life of an airman to be challenging, yet rewarding, and
14	he worked and trained hard, and his superiors recognized his efforts by promoting him to
15	Sergeant and assigning him greater responsibility; and
16	WHEREAS, Sergeant Kelly would spend ten years in the U.S. Air Force, serving
17	assignments in Germany and Italy with great success and learning much about the world and

2	serve two tours in Iraq and one in Saudi Arabia with courage and commitment while he
3	began to renew his efforts to get a college degree; and
4	WHEREAS, Sergeant Kelly would marry Natashia Saxon on March 20, 2006, and
5	from that union would father two beautiful children, Johnny James Kelly Jr., and Nijalay
6	Amari-Lynn Kelly, who were the lights of his life; and
7	WHEREAS, Sergeant Kelly was serving on his final tour in Las Vegas, Nevada, with
8	plans to get his discharge from military service and to renew his college career and achieve
9	a college degree; and
10	WHEREAS, in his final days of service to his country, Sergeant Kelly thought often

12	a life that would allow him to be home and closer to his children; and
