

1 WHEREAS, such systems could take advantage of improvements in technology to
2 increase voter turnout.

3 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
4 authorize and request the House Committee on House and Governmental Affairs and the
5 Senate Committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs to meet and function as a joint
6 committee to study the use of mobile voting systems.

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint committee shall solicit input,
8 recommendations, and advice from the following:

- 9 (1) The secretary of state.
- 10 (2) The commissioner of elections.
- 11 (3) The attorney general.
- 12 (4) The Louisiana Clerks of Court Association.
- 13 (5) The Louisiana Registrars of Voters Association.
- 14 (6) The Police Jury Association of Louisiana.
- 15 (7) Each recognized political party.
- 16 (8) The Advocacy Center.
- 17 (9) The League of Women Voters.
- 18 (10) The U.S. Election Assistance Commission.
- 19 (11) The National Association of Secretaries of State.
- 20 (12) The National Conference of State Legislatures.
- 21 (13) The Council of State Governments.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint committee shall report its findings to
23 the legislature prior to the convening of the 2017 Regular Session of the Legislature.
