LEGISLATIVE AGENCIES. Provides relative to the Louisiana State Law Institute. (1/1/17)

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 24:202(F) and (G), relative to the Louisiana State Law Institute; to provide
3 relative to its powers, duties, and functions; to provide relative to the Law Institute
4 Council; to provide certain procedures, requirements, and effects; and to provide for
5 related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 24:202(F) and (G) are hereby enacted to read as follows:

8 §202. Council; membership; terms; vacancies; meetings

9 * * *

10 **F.(1) All meetings of the council shall be held at a public building open**
11 **to the public and available without charge. At least two-thirds of all council**
12 **meetings conducted each year shall be held in Baton Rouge.**

13 **(2) For council meetings held in Baton Rouge, preference shall be given**
14 **to meeting at the state capitol if space is available. If space is not available, each**
15 **public entity in Baton Rouge is authorized and encouraged to make meeting**
16 **space available to the institute without charge.**

17 **G. Meetings of the institute shall be subject to the Open Meetings Law**

1 **and the Public Records Law.**

2 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2017.

Present law provides for the Louisiana State Law Institute and its powers, duties, and functions. Includes the membership, terms, duties and functions of the Law Institute Council.

Proposed law retains present law and adds that all meetings of the council shall be held at a public building open to the public and available without charge. At least two-thirds of all council meetings conducted each year shall be in Baton Rouge.

Proposed law further provides that, for council meetings held in Baton Rouge, preference shall be given to meeting at the state capitol if space is available. If space is not available, each public entity in Baton Rouge is authorized and encouraged to make meeting space available to the institute without charge.

Proposed law further provides that meetings of the institute shall be subject to the Open Meetings Law and Public Records law.

Effective January 1, 2017.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary A to the original bill

1. Provides that the meetings shall be held at a public building open to the public and available without charge and that at least two-thirds, rather than all, of such meetings occur in Baton Rouge.
2. Authorizes and encourages public entities in Baton Rouge to make meeting space available to the institute without charge.
3. Clarifies that institute meetings are subject to the Open Meetings Law and Public Records Law.
