VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS. Requests the LCTCS board to develop and provide orientation programs to middle school students.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 To urge and request the Board of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges to direct each institution in its system to coordinate with local employers to develop and 3 provide orientation programs to students, beginning in middle school and continuing 4 5 until graduation, regarding the occupational programs available that will prepare 6 students for high-paying, skilled careers that are in high demand in their local area. 7 WHEREAS, by 2020, almost two-thirds of the nation's jobs and fifty-two 8 percent of Louisiana's jobs will require a postsecondary credential; and 9 WHEREAS, only seventy-two percent of Louisiana's students graduate from 10 high school on time and less than thirty percent of Louisiana's citizens hold an 11 associate's degree or higher; and WHEREAS, Louisiana employers continually cite a skills gap in our state's 12 13 labor market; and WHEREAS, studies suggest that career and occupation choices are made as 14 early as childhood and having knowledge of local high quality career and technical 15 16 education programs has a positive impact on timely high school graduation and 17 postsecondary educational choices; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana's public school students must develop an individual

graduation plan in the eighth grade to help guide their high school course choices, and knowledge of careers in demand in their local area will aid students in making such plans.
