HB42	Wright	SCHOOLS/CHOICE	Authorizes parents to appeal a local school board's denial of school enrollment requests to the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (Item #42)

Requires that student identification cards issued by certain postsecondary education institutions meet certain requirements (Item #42)

- HB51 Miguez ELECTIONS
Provides for prohibition of using private funds for any part of our election system (Item #5)
- Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 68, nays 28. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.
- HB52 Edmonds PUBLIC HEALTH/OFFICE
Requires regular reporting of the number of school-age children known to have an infectious disease during a public health emergency relating to the disease (Item #28)
- Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 92, nays 0. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.
- HB56 Bagley SCHOOLS
Authorizes administration of medical marijuana to a student by a parent, guardian, or authorized school employee at a public school (Item #42)
- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 67, nays 18. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.
- HB57 Edmonds LEGISLATIVE POWERS
Provides relative to the emergency powers of the governor (Items #1, 2, 28, and 41)
- Read by title, returned to the calendar.
- HB59 Beaulieu ELECTIONS
Authorizes the payment of additional compensation to certain election officials for elections held within a certain period following a gubernatorially declared emergency (Item #5)
- Rules suspended, called out of its regular order.

Creates the "Louisiana Agricultural Workforce Development Program" (Item #67)

Creates a work-sharing program (Item #8)

- HB94 Zeringue FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Provides relative to fees charged to businesses by state agencies during a state of emergency (Items #2, 32, and 35)
- Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 93, nays 0. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.
- HB97 Bacala RETIREMENT/STATE SYSTEMS
Provides relative to reemployment of retirees during a declared emergency (Item #2)
- Read by title, substitute title adopted, lies over in the same order of business, substitute for HB No. 36 reported by the Committee on Retirement (7-0).
- HB98 Edmonds HEALTH CARE/FACILITIES
Provides relative to visitation by members of the clergy of patients and residents at certain licensed health facilities during public health emergencies (Items #28 and 59)
- Read by title, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading.
 - Scheduled for floor debate on 10/14/20.
- HCR1 Dwight SCHOOLS/FINANCE-MFP
Requests the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to take all necessary measures to ensure that the Calcasieu and Cameron parish school systems are not penalized in terms of funding due to Hurricane Laura
- Read by title, returned to the calendar.
- HCR2 Johnson, Mike UTILITIES
Urges and requests the Louisiana Attorney General to investigate certain companies doing business in the state to determine if the companies have engaged in prohibited activities

- HCR7 Coussan ENERGY/OIL & GAS
Memorializes Congress to require the Federal Emergency Management Agency to more efficiently coordinate the removal of dislocated oilfield equipment after natural disasters in Louisiana
- Read by title, roll called on final consideration, yeas 99, nays 0. The resolution was adopted and ordered to the Senate.
- HCR8 DeVillier ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE PERMT
Suspends the enforcement authority of the commissioner of alcohol and tobacco control for violations of COVID-19-related restrictions (Items #28, 32, 35, and 60)
- Read by title, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading.
 - Scheduled for floor debate on 10/14/20.
- HCR17 Romero SCHOOLS/FINANCE-MFP

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Requests the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to discuss possible adjustments to the Minimum Foundation Program formula in order to ensure adequate funding for school systems affected by Hurricane Laura or Hurricane Delta

HCR22 Johnson, Travis TRANSPORTATION
Urges and requests the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism, office of tourism, to study the feasibility of creating a bike and walking trail along the Mississippi River in Northeast Louisiana

HCR23 Schexnayder CONGRESS
Memorializes the United States Senate to confirm the nomination of Judge Amy Coney Barrett to the United States Supreme Court

- Read by title, roll called on final consideration, yeas 70, nays 16. The resolution was adopted and ordered to the Senate.

HCR24 Romero AGRICULTURE
Memorializes Congress and the Louisiana congressional delegation to take such actions as necessary to fully fund the Livestock Indemnity Program in response to the negative impact created by losses to the Louisiana livestock industry as a result of Hurricane Laura
