HB44	Magee	LOCAL GOVERNMENT	Provides relative to prohibiting alcoholic beverage sales during a COVID-19 health emergency (Item #35) - Reported with amendments (11-0). - Rules suspended. - Read by title, amended, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading. - Scheduled for floor debate on 10/19/20.
HB81	Garofalo	STUDENTS	Prohibits a school from sharing a student's personally identifiable information relative to illness or

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disease with the Dept. of Health for purposes of the Sanitary Code or any other purpose without parental consent (Item #42)

Butler EXCEP PERSON/DEV DISABLE

Requires the La. Department of Health to allow visitation of residents at intermediate care facilities by residents' family members during a public health emergency (Item #28)

- Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 95, nays 0. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.

HB96

Freeman STUDENTS

Provides relative to sharing of student information for the purpose of administering the pandemic electronic benefits transfer (P-EBT) program (Item #28)

- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 0. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.

HB97

Bacala RETIREMENT/STATE SYSTEMS

Provides relative to reemployment of retirees during a declared emergency (Item #2)

- Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 93, nays 0. The bill, having received two-thirds vote of the elected members, was finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.

HCR3

Bourriaque CONGRESS

Memorializes congress and the Louisiana congressional delegation to take such actions as are necessary to require the Federal Emergency Management Agency to grant Louisiana full federal funding for disaster expenses associated with Hurricane Laura or to grant Louisiana the ability to utilize alternative sources of federal funds as any needed match if full funding is not provided

Bourriaque FEDERAL PROGRAMS

Requests the division of administration, office of community development, to include certain activities as eligible expenses in the development of its Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Recovery Program Action Plans

- Enrolled and signed by the Speaker of the House.

HCR23

Schexnayder CONGRESS

Memorializes the United States Senate to confirm the nomination of Judge Amy Coney Barrett to the United States Supreme Court

- Received from the Senate without amendments.

HCR29

Butler EXCEP PERSON/DEV DISABLE

Amends administrative rules regarding leave of absence days for clients of intermediate care facilities (Items #28 and 29)

- Read by title, roll called on final consideration, yeas 93, nays 0. The resolution was adopted and ordered to the Senate.

SB18 Cathey FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Provides an exemption to certain permit fees collected by the Office of Alcohol and Tobacco Control. (gov sig) (Item #35)

- Reported favorably (10-0). Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- Rules suspended.
- Read by title, passed to 3rd reading.
- Scheduled for floor debate on 10/19/20.

SB21 Hewitt CIVIL SERVICE DEPARTMENT
Provides for revisions to the fee structure and oversight of the in-service training and educational programs for state employees by the Department of State Civil Service. (1/1/21) (Item #52)

- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB22 Hewitt VOTERS/VOTING
Provides for preparation and counting of absentee and early voting ballots. (gov sig) (Item #5)

- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 92, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB23 McMath SCHOOLS
Requires school boards to accept certification of illness from a nurse practitioner or physician assistant when employees use leave due to personal illness. (gov sig) (Item #42)

- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 91, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB26 Peterson LOCAL EMPLOYEES
Removes employees of the Regional Transit Authority from the state system and state civil service. (gov sig) (Item #62)

- Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB31 Fields EDUCATION ACCOUNTABILITY
Prohibits use of statewide student assessments conducted during the 2020-2021 school year for the purposes of evaluating teacher performance or student placement decisions. (gov sig) (Item #42)

- Read by title, returned to the calendar.
- Called from the calendar.
- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 93, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB39 Hewitt LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS
Provides for remote operations of the legislature during a gubernatorially declared state of emergency. (gov sig) (Item #25)

- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 91, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB44 Fields COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES
Constitutional amendment to authorize the governor to appoint persons who reside out-of-state as

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certain at-large members of public postsecondary education boards of supervisors. (2/3 - CA13s1(A)) (Item #42)

- Read by title, amended, recommitted to the Committee on Civil Law and Procedure.

SB45

Fields

COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES

Provides for the "Lod Cook Act" which authorizes the governor to appoint persons who reside out-of-state at certain at-large members of the public postsecondary boards of supervisors. (See Act) (Item #42)

- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 94, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

EMPLOYMENT

Provides for the rehiring of nonlicensed persons by certain health care providers required to temporarily close during a public health emergency. (gov sig) (Item #28)

- Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title, referred to the Committee on Health and Welfare.

SB55

Cortez

UNEMPLOYMENT COMP

Provides for the unemployment insurance procedure to be applied by the administrator for calendar year 2021. (gov sig) (Items #8 and #30)

- Reported favorably (12-0). Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- Rules suspended.
- Read by title, passed to 3rd reading.
- Scheduled for floor debate on 10/19/20.

HEALTH/ACC INSURANCE

Provides relative to health maintenance organizations. (gov sig) (Item #32)

- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 94, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB67

Reese

ECONOMIC DEVELOP DEPT

Authorizes the Department of Economic Development to provide an extension for certain job creation requirements for enterprise zone incentives and quality jobs incentive rebates due to the impacts of COVID-19, Hurricane Laura, and Hurricane Delta. (gov sig) (Items #26 and #65)

- Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title, referred to the Committee on Commerce.

LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS

Provides for legislative approval of BESE adopted adjustments to the MFP formula by ballot when the legislature is not in session. (See CA3s19) (Item #4)

- Read by title, returned to the calendar.
- Notice given.
- Scheduled for floor debate on 10/19/20.

GAMING

Provides relative to fantasy sports. (gov sig) (Item #32)

- Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title, referred to the Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice.

Requests LCTCS and Sowela administrators to work together to study the impacts of hurricanes Laura and Delta on the institution and its student body in order to inform any legislative requests for the 2021 Regular Session.
- Read by title, concurred in by vote of 95 yeas, 0 nays.
- SCR3 Cathey TOPS
Requests the Board of Regents to study allowing TOPS and GO Grant awards to be used for summer semester immediately following high school graduation.
- Read by title, concurred in by vote of 97 yeas, 0 nays.
- SCR5 Reese EMPLOYMENT
Suspends certain provisions of law relative to the application of certain wages and benefits for the next calendar year. (Items #8 and #30)
- Reported favorably (13-0).
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- Rules suspended.
- Read by title, passed to 3rd reading.
- Scheduled for floor debate on 10/19/20.
- SCR6 Abraham BESE
Requests BESE to adopt adjustments to the MFP formula to ensure that school districts impacted by Hurricane Laura do not lose funding during the 2020-2021 fiscal year due to decreases in student enrollment.
- Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SCR9 Cortez UNEMPLOYMENT COMP
Suspends the provision of law providing for an unemployment insurance solvency tax. (Items #8 and #30)
- Discharged from the Committee on Labor and Industrial Relations.
- Read by title, recommitted to the Committee on Appropriations.
