Authorizes Plaquemines Port, Harbor and Terminal District to apply for designation as a foreign trade zone. (See CA3s19) (Item #47)  
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 34 yeas and 0 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB12 Mills, Robert HEALTH CARE  
Provides access for patients of hospitals and residents of nursing homes, assisted living facilities, and other adult residential care homes to members of the clergy who volunteer to minister and provide religious sacraments and services, counseling, and mental health support during COVID-19 and other public health emergencies. (gov sig) (Item #28)  
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 34 yeas and 0 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB13 Peacock HEALTH SERVICES  
Provides for the Recognition of Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact (REPLICA). (7/1/21) (Item #44)  
- Read by title, passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays, and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB15 Milligan SCHOOLS  
Requires first-day health insurance coverage for employees of public elementary and secondary school systems under certain circumstances. (gov sig) (Item #42)  
- Read by title and returned to the Calendar, subject to call.
- SB24 Talbot FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS  
Provides an exemption to certain fees collected by the Louisiana Department of Health. (gov sig) (Item #32)  
- Read by title, passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays, and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB27 Peacock HEALTH CARE  
Provides relative to the practice of medicine. (2/3 - CA7s2.1(A)) (7/1/21) (Item #45)  
- Read by title, passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays, and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB34 Peacock SPEECH/PATH/AUDIO  
Provides for the Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology Interstate Compact (ASLP-IC). (7/1/21) (Item #37)  
- Read by title, passed by a vote of 34 yeas and 0 nays, and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB38 White, B FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides relative to the creation, use, dedication, and transfer of funds in the state treasury. (gov sig) (Item #16)  
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 32 yeas and 0 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB47 Peterson FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides for the allocation of certain funds in the state treasury. (gov sig) (Items #16 and #19)  
- Read by title and returned to the Calendar, subject to call.

Provides for immunizations, including the COVID-19 vaccine, to be administered by pharmacists. (See Act) (Item #40)

- SB52 Reese TAX/AD VALOREM  
Provides for credits for certain ad valorem taxes paid for the 2020 tax year. (gov sig) (Item #26)  
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 33 yeas and 0 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB53 McMath EMPLOYMENT  
Provides for the rehiring of nonlicensed persons by certain health care providers required to temporarily close during a public health emergency. (gov sig) (Item #28)  
- Read by title and returned to the Calendar, subject to call.
- SB55 Cortez UNEMPLOYMENT COMP  
Provides for the unemployment insurance procedure to be applied by the administrator for calendar year 2021. (gov sig) (Items #8 and #30)  
- Read by title, passed by a vote of 35 yeas and 0 nays, and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB62 Smith, G. TAX/AD VALOREM  
Provides for the refundable portion of the inventory tax credit for certain manufacturers impacted by the 2020 emergencies and disasters. (gov sig) (Item #26)  
- Read by title, passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays, and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB66 Carter, Troy PUBLIC RECORDS  
To provide relative to the disclosure of certain personal information of appointed and certain elected officials. (gov sig) (Item #46)  
- Read by title and returned to the Calendar, subject to call.
- SB69 Johns EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS  
Provides relative to emergency service plans of certain providers. (gov sig) (2/3 - CA7s2.1(A)) (Items #2 and #38)  
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB71 Peacock PUBLIC MEETINGS  
Provides for participation in certain meetings by teleconferencing or other electronic means for legislative bodies. (gov sig) (Item #25)  
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 27 yeas and 8 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB72 Talbot TAX/INCOME/CORPORATE  
Authorizes an income tax credit for certain businesses whose operations were interrupted as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. (gov sig) (Items #26 and #65)  
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
