Motion to reconsider tabled.</li><li>- Senate conference committee appointed: Amedee, Fontenot, and Chaisson.</li><li>- Notice House conferees appointed.</li></ul>
SB10	Nevers	UNEMPLOYMENT COMP	Provides for unemployment compensation benefits. (gov sig) <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Amendments proposed by the House read and concurred in, 37 yeas and 0 nays. Motion to reconsider tabled.</li></ul>
SB27	Dupre	FUNDS/FUNDING	Constitutional amendment to change name of Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Fund to Coastal Protection and Restoration Fund, and provide that certain federal revenues received by the state generated from Outer Continental Shelf oil and gas activity shall be credited to the fund and used only for certain purposes. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Received from the House with amendments.</li></ul>
SB71	Dupre	COASTAL RESOURCES	Authorizes development and implementation of a comprehensive coastal protection plan. (gov sig) <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Received from the House with amendments.</li></ul>
SB111	Gautreaux, B.	STATE EMPLOYEE RET	Provides for early retirement as an alternative to involuntary workforce reduction and individual agency cuts. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Read by title, recommitted to the Committee on Retirement.</li><li>- By a vote of 19 yeas and 17 nays.</li></ul>
SCR17	Shepherd	FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS	Requests financial institutions doing business throughout the state to delay the monthly residential mortgage installment for December, 2005, for individuals in certain hurricane affected areas of the state. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Received from the House without amendments.</li></ul>
SCR25	Hollis	ECONOMIC DEVELOP DEPT	Urge and request the governor and the secretary of the Department of Economic Development to continue to study and make recommendations relative to enhancing air service options to all markets with the state. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Read by title, adopted by the vote of 38 yeas and 0 nays and ordered to the House.</li><li>- Received from the House without amendments.</li></ul>
SCR27	Dupre	CONGRESS	Memorializes Congress to vote against the repealing of the "Byrd Amendment." <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Received from the House without amendments.</li></ul>

SCR32	Michot	NATURAL RESOURCES DEPT	

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Urges and requests the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Transportation and Development in conjunction with other public and private entities to conduct a feasibility study on the construction of a coastal barrier and intracoastal highway.

SCR33 McPherson CONGRESS  
Memorializes Congress to mandate that federal contracts awarded for reconstruction of the Gulf Coast region give a preference to local contractors and workers.

SCR34 Gautreaux, B. COMMENDATIONS  
Recognizes General Hunt Downer for his untiring courage and self-less devotion to duty during Hurricane Katrina and thereafter.

HB3 Toomy RECORDS/RECORDATION  
Changes the effective date of Act 169 of the 2005 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana (Item #67)

HB7 Salter LEGISLATIVE EXPENSES  
Provides relative to payment of certain expenses related to the legislative offices of certain temporarily displaced legislators (Item #62)

- Read by title and finally passed, 37 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

HB8 Odinet FISHING/OYSTERS  
Provides relative to oyster lease renewals in 2006 (Item #48)

- Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call

HB9 LaFleur ETHICS  
Requires elected officials and appointed state officials to disclose information regarding certain contracts and subcontracts (Item #6)

- Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call as amended.

HB11 Smiley MTR VEHICLE/REGISTRATION  
Provides for disposal of water-damaged vehicles (Item #13)

- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and finally passed as amended, 20 yeas and 17 nays; title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

HB15 Cazayoux TRANSPORTATION DEPT  
Provides relative to the contents of the petition to expropriate property for a design-build project

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undertaken by the Department of Transportation and Development (Item #47)

- Signed by the President of the Senate.

- HB19 Crane EDUCATION/PRE-K  
Provides for the applicability of provisions relative to the requirements for student/lead teacher and student/adult staff member ratios for LA 4 classes (Item #38)  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB20 Crane SCHOOLS/BOARDS  
Provides for the applicability of provisions relative to the required dates for school boards to adopt budgets and submit such budgets to the state superintendent of education (Item #38)  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB21 Crane SCHOOLS  
Provides for applicability of provisions relative to the requirement for a minimum school session of not less than 180 days for certain purposes (Item #38)  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB22 Crane STUDENTS  
Provides for applicability of provisions relative to the requirement for testing the sight and hearing of pupils within 30 days after the admission of any pupils entering school late in the session (Item #38)  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB28 Martiny LAW ENFORCEMENT  
Limits liability of law enforcement agencies to prison detainees (Item #69)  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB33 Crane SCHOOLS  
Provides for applicability of provisions relative to minimum requirements for instructional time including certain work days per school year under specified circumstances (Item #38)  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB35 Arnold TAX/AD VALOREM TAX  
Provides for a change of the time and date when the assessor of Orleans Parish has to complete the work on preparing and making up the assessment lists for the year 2006 (Item #42)  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB45 Hammett TAX  
Provides for the furnishing of tax information to the taxpayer or his duly authorized representative (Item #49)  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB56 Pinac GAMBLING  
Provides with respect to slot machine purse supplements during force majeure  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB78 Martiny GAMBLING  
Provides for definition of eligible facility during force majeure  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB156 Alario APPROPRIATIONS/SUPPLEML  
Supplemental appropriations and reductions in appropriations for Fiscal Year 2005-2006 (Item #30)  
- Rules suspended

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- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and finally passed as amended, 35 yeas and 3 nays; title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

- HCR2 Lancaster VOTING/REGISTRATION  
Suspends the provisions of law relative to the annual canvass of voters until 60 days after the 2006 Regular Session (Item #56)  
- Read by title and concurred in by the vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays and ordered to the House.
- HCR26 Pinac RACING/HORSE  
Suspends the provision of law requiring minimum number of live racing days  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HCR39 Scalise WEAPONS/FIREARMS  
Requests the governor to include in the call of this session legislation to protect inherent rights of citizens  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HCR44 Carter, K. INSURANCE/HEALTH  
Memorializes congress to enact a health insurance premium reimbursement program and a federal income tax credit for the health insurance premiums for affected victims of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HCR50 Baldone CONGRESS  
Memorializes congress to forgive the debt of Louisiana's local governments resulting from \$750 million in loans available to them as disaster relief  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HCR52 Bowler COMMENDATIONS  
Commends Dr. Diane M. Roussel, Superintendent of the Jefferson Parish Public School System, upon being named Superintendent of the Year by the Louisiana Association of School Executives  
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
