DRUGS/PRESCRIPTION: Provides relative to redispensing of drugs in correctional facility pharmacies

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

1. Revises provision referring to pharmacies that provide prescriptions to a local law enforcement office or department to refer instead to pharmacies authorized by the La. Board of Pharmacy to provide prescriptions to a local law enforcement office or department.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> requires that drugs dispensed for use by an offender in the custody of the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections be accepted for return, exchange, and redispensing.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the pharmacist in charge shall determine that the prescription is unmolested, unexpired, and fit to be redispensed.

<u>Present law</u> releases the pharmaceutical manufacturer from liability for any claim or injury arising from the redispensing of any prescription drug.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>, and extends the law to include prescriptions dispensed for use by offenders in the custody of local law enforcement offices or departments.

<u>Proposed law</u> creates an exception to <u>present law</u> and <u>proposed law</u>, which exception stipulates that a drug that can be dispensed only to a patient registered with the drug's manufacturer in accordance with federal Food and Drug Administration requirements shall not be accepted or redispensed by the correctional facility pharmacy program provided for in <u>present law</u> and <u>proposed law</u>.
