8	from its eastern border of St. Martin and St. Mary parishes to its southern border at the coast
9	of the Gulf of Mexico on to its western border of Lake Charles, St. Landry, Evangeline, and
10	Beauregard parishes; and
11	WHEREAS, the Veterans Action Coalition of Southwest Louisiana was founded in
12	2010 by veterans Rodney Hamilton and the late Bob Lowe with the stated mission to assure
13	that all local veterans obtain the highest quality medical care available; and
14	WHEREAS, the coalition, in the face of daunting odds has remained steadfast in its
15	mission, partnering with Louisiana's congressional delegation to lead the fight in
16	Washington for these long-overdue facilities in the region; and
17	WHEREAS, due to the tremendous efforts of these brave men, construction of a
18	state-of-the-art, 11.2 million dollar Community Based Outpatient Clinic in Lafayette will

triple the number of examination rooms in the current clinic, while also providing additional space for social workers, dieticians, pharmacists, and other medical services that are currently not available; and
