CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

HB 385

Keyword and oneliner of the instrument as it left the House

CRIME: Creates the crime of providing false, nonexistent, or incomplete declaration of residence for bail

Report adopts Senate amendments to:

1. Delete presumption that an address is false, nonexistent, or incomplete if the peace officer or authorized agent makes a return of record that the address is false, nonexistent, or incomplete or if the mailed notice is returned for similar reasons.
2. Rephrase the elements of the crime and provides that the action must be done "knowingly".
3. Make technical changes.

Report rejects Senate amendments which would have:

1. Used duplicative language regarding "knowingly".

Digest of the bill as proposed by the Conference Committee

Proposed law prohibits any person from knowingly giving or placing on any bail bond or declaration of residence false, nonexistent, or incomplete information for purposes of service or notice.

Proposed law provides criminal penalties for misdemeanor cases including imprisonment for not more than six months, or a fine of not more than \$500, or both. For felonies, the criminal penalties include imprisonment at hard labor for not more than two years.
