<u>Prior law</u> required individuals who apply for a driver's license to submit written evidence of successful completion of either a "driver education course" or "prelicensing training course".

<u>Prior law</u> required the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, to establish rules and regulations to administer and define the requirements of driver education and prelicensing training courses.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>prior law</u> and requires driver education and prelicensing training courses to include course content relative to trailer safety.

<u>Prior law</u> required that individuals, as part of the application procedure to obtain a license to operate a motor vehicle, to pass a road knowledge test which includes rules of the road, signs, and signals, sharing the road with motorcycles and tractor/trailer trucks, economic effects of littering, distracted driving, and not less than two questions relative to railroad and highway grade crossing safety, and knowledge of all relevant traffic regulations.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>prior law</u> but requires that the road knowledge test include knowledge of trailer safety.

Effective August 1, 2016.
