1 A RESOLUTION

2 To commend Jerry J. Guillot, Chief of Staff of the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana,
3 for the leadership he provides as head of staff infrastructure and for the tremendous
4 efforts he puts forth to coordinate the successful operation of this legislative body.

5 WHEREAS, Jerry Guillot is an integral part of every legislative day; his managerial
6 skill is crucial to the placement of committee staff, to the drafting and review of requests,
7 and to the rendering of focused attention to extraordinary situations; and
