

RÉSUMÉ DIGEST**ACT 101 (HB 193)****2016 Regular Session****Hunter**

Existing law provides that a member of the legislature and a legislative employee shall have peremptory grounds for continuance or extension of a criminal case, civil case, or administrative proceeding.

Existing law provides that the peremptory grounds for continuance are available:

- (1) Any time between 15 days prior to the original call to order and 15 days following the adjournment sine die of any legislative session.
- (2) Any time between 15 days prior to convening and 15 days following adjournment sine die of any constitutional convention.

New law retains existing law but extends the 15-day period to a 30-day period for any session of the legislature and any constitutional convention.

Existing law also provides that when such person is engaged in activities in connection with or ordered by: (1) the legislature; (2) any legislative committee or subcommittee appointed by the president of the Senate or the speaker of the House of Representatives; (3) any committee or commission appointed by the governor or other person authorized to make such appointments; or (4) any constitutional convention or commission.

New law retains existing law and adds "travel" as an activity subject to the automatic continuance.

Effective August 1, 2016.
