Abstract: Allows an immediate family member, excluding the spouse, of a member of the La. State Racing Commission to obtain certain licenses from the commission and engage in the activities authorized by such licenses.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 42:1113(B) - ethics code) prohibits a member of the immediate family of an appointed member of a board or commission from entering into or being in anyway interested in a transaction under the supervision or jurisdiction of the board or commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides an exception to allow a member of the immediate family, excluding the spouse, of a member of the La. State Racing Commission to obtain a license from the commission pursuant to <u>present law</u> (R.S. 4:150) and to engage in the activities authorized by such licenses in accordance with applicable laws, rules, and regulations. <u>Proposed law</u> further prohibits the commission member from participating in any matter involving his immediate family member as provided in <u>present law</u> (R.S. 42:1112) and requires that he recuse himself from participating in any commission action regarding any matter related to his immediate family member in the manner provided by <u>present law</u> (R.S. 42:1120.4).

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 42:1112 - ethics code) prohibits a public servant from participating in a transaction involving his governmental entity when the public servant has or specified related persons have a substantial economic interest. <u>Present law</u> (R.S. 42:1120.4 - ethics code) further requires an appointed member of a board or commission to recuse himself from voting if he would be required to vote on a matter that would be a violation of <u>present law</u> (R.S. 42:1112) and prohibits such a member from participating in the discussion and debate concerning the matter. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and applies the recusal provisions to matters arising pursuant to the exception in <u>proposed law</u>.
