DIGEST 2017 Regular Session

Bishop

<u>Present law</u> requires a law enforcement officer (state police, sheriff, or local police officer) to investigate and report traffic accidents within their jurisdiction to the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the superintendent of police in any parish with a population of not less than 250,000 nor more than 350,000, based upon the latest federal decennial census, to authorize a civilian traffic control officer or entity to investigate traffic accidents except when the traffic accident (1) results in the death or injury to any person; (2) involves a driver who refuses to or cannot provide a driver's license, proof of insurance, or vehicle registration; or (3) involves a driver who is suspected of being under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, or other controlled substances.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the superintendent of police to establish qualifications for and provide training to a civilian traffic control officer or entity that meets the qualifications prior to conducting any traffic accident investigation under <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the civilian traffic control officer or entity to provide an accident report to the DPS&C and to immediately report the accident to the parish police department if he believes a criminal offense has occurred or the accident (1) results in the death or injury to any person; (2) involves a driver who refuses to or cannot provide a driver's license, proof of insurance, or vehicle registration; or (3) involves a driver who is suspected of being under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, or other controlled substances.
