## FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS: Establishes a temporary permit fee for food and beverage vendors at fairs and festivals

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:4.7 and 4.8, relative to permit fees for food and beverage
3	vendors at fairs and festivals; to require a temporary permit fee for food and
4	beverage vendors at the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival; to authorize a
5	temporary permit fee for food and beverage vendors at fairs and festivals; to
6	establish the amount of the fee; to make technical changes; to provide for an
7	effective date; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 40:4.7 and 4.8 are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
10	§4.7. New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival
11	A. Food Each food and beverage services vendor at the New Orleans Jazz
12	and Heritage Festival shall be subject to permitting, inspection, and compliance with
13	applicable provisions of the state sanitary code and especially the special event food
14	and beverage preparation regulations that pertain to equipment, design, construction,
15	utensils, supplies, preparation, and services. The festival shall not be subject to
16	exemptions granted in R.S. 40:4.5.
17	B. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of the state sanitary code or any
18	contrary provision of any other law or regulation, the Louisiana Department of
19	Health shall charge a temporary permit fee in the amount of thirty-seven dollars and
20	fifty cents to each food and beverage vendor at the festival.

2	A.(1) The Louisiana Department of Health shall inspect and may permit foo		
3	booths at recognized Louisiana fairs and festivals for compliance with the speci		
4	event food and beverage preparation regulations upon written request and signed		
5	agreement from the officials or organizations operating or directing such the fairs		
6	festivals. Such The inspections shall be voluntary on the part of the officials of		
7	organizers of the fairs and festivals. The department shall exercise the enforcement		
8	powers authorized by the state's sanitary code when complying with a request and		
9	agreement executed in accordance with this Section.		
10	(2) The department may establish and charge reasonable fees for such the		
11	inspections and permitting consistent with current administrative regulations. Such		
12	fee The fees shall not exceed twenty-five dollars per thirty-seven dollars and fifty		
13	cents for each food and beverage vendor at each fair or festival.		
14	B. Neither the department nor the state shall be liable for a failure to inspect		
15	any fair or festival when the officials or organizations operating or directing such the		
16	fair or festival fail to make a written request and execute a signed agreement for such		
17	the inspection pursuant to this Section.		
18	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if no		
19	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature		
20	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If		
21	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become		
22 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Requires a temporary permit fee for each food and beverage vendor at fairs and festivals including the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival.

<u>Present law</u> provides that food and beverage services at the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival are subject to inspection and compliance with applicable provisions of the state

sanitary code including the special event food and beverage preparation regulations that pertain to equipment, design, construction, utensils, supplies, preparation, and services.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes food and beverage services to food and beverage vendor and subjects the vendor to permitting requirements.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the La. Dept. of Health (LDH) to charge a temporary permit fee in the amount of \$37.50 to each food and beverage vendor at the festival.

<u>Present law</u> requires LDH to inspect and authorizes LDH to permit food booths at recognized La. fairs and festivals for compliance with the special event food and beverage preparation regulations upon written request and signed agreement from the officials or organizations operating or directing the fairs or festivals.

Proposed law retains present law but makes technical changes.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes LDH to establish and charge reasonable fees for inspections consistent with current administrative regulations not exceed \$25 per fair or festival.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the inspection fee to a temporary permit fee and increases the maximum amount of the fee to \$37.50 for each food and beverage vendor at the fair or festival.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
