LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS. Recognizes May 3, 2017, as Purple and Teal Day in the state of Louisiana.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To recognize May 3, 2017, as "Purple and Teal Day" in the state of Louisiana.
3	WHEREAS, the members of the Legislature of Louisiana recognize the need to
4	address violence against women; and
5	WHEREAS, domestic violence and sexual assault are serious crimes that affect
6	people of all races, ages, genders, and income levels; and
7	WHEREAS, domestic violence and sexual assault are widespread and affect millions
8	of Americans each year; and
9	WHEREAS, Louisiana currently ranks second in the nation for domestic homicides,
10	having consistently led the nation for the past two decades; and
11	WHEREAS, over one million women and men in Louisiana are sexually assaulted
12	during their lifetimes, costing individuals, employers, and governmental institutions an
13	average of one hundred twenty-two thousand four hundred sixty-one dollars per rape; and
14	WHEREAS, the crimes of domestic violence and sexual assault violate an
15	individual's privacy, dignity, security, and humanity due to the systematic use of physical,
16	emotional, sexual, psychological, and economic control and abuse; and
17	WHEREAS, children who grow up in violent homes are believed to be abused and
18	neglected at higher rates than the national average; and

1	WHEREAS, women are murdered at a rate about forty percent higher than the
2	national average in Louisiana, and Louisiana consistently leads the nation in domestic
3	homicides; and
4	WHEREAS, on May 3, 2017, the Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence
5	and the Louisiana Foundation Against Sexual Assault host their annual day at the Louisiana
6	State Capitol with displays on the steps and in the rotunda of the Capitol; and
7	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence is the federally
8	designated statewide coalition of shelters, nonresidential programs, and individuals working
9	to end domestic violence in Louisiana; and
10	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Foundation Against Sexual Assault is the federally
11	designated membership organization of sexual assault crisis centers, allied professionals, and
12	individuals across the state of Louisiana; and
13	WHEREAS, Purple and Teal Day provides an excellent opportunity for the citizens
14	of Louisiana to learn more about preventing domestic violence and sexual assault and to
15	show support for the numerous organizations and individuals who provide critical advocacy
16	services, and assistance to victims.
17	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
18	recognize May 3, 2017, as "Purple and Teal Day" in the state of Louisiana, does hereby
19	commend and encourage diligence against violence against women, and does hereby urge
20	all citizens and all community organizations to join in this observance.
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
22	Louisiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence.
