<u>Present law</u> provides that district attorneys serve as the regular attorneys and counsel for the police juries within their respective districts. However, <u>present law</u> does not prevent or prohibit the governing authorities of the parishes of St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, Ouachita, Morehouse, Calcasieu, and Vermilion from each employing or retaining its own attorney to represent it generally. <u>Present law</u> provides that the employment of attorneys by said governing authorities relieve the district attorneys of the judicial districts serving the parishes of St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, Ouachita, Morehouse, Calcasieu, and Vermilion from any further duty of representing said governing authorities.

Proposed law retains present law.

Further provides that <u>present law</u> does not prevent or prohibit the governing authority of any parish having a population of not less than 60,000 nor more than 70,000 persons, based upon the most recent federal decennial census, from each employing or retaining its own attorney to represent it generally. In such event, the district attorney of the judicial district serving the parish is relieved from any further duty of representing said governing authority.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
