AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 11:1316 and 1345.8, relative to members of the Louisiana State
3	Police Retirement System killed in the line of duty by an intentional act of violence;
4	to provide for the survivor benefits of these members; to provide for qualifications
5	to receive such survivor benefits; to provide for benefit calculations; to provide for
6	an effective date; and to provide for related matters.
7	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 11:1316 and 1345.8 are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
10	follows:
11	§1316. Death in the line of duty; death by an intentional act of violence; certain
12	members hired on or before December 31, 2010; pension of benefit
13	<b>for</b> surviving spouse of deceased employee; minor children with no

15	A. This Section shall apply to any sworn commissioned law enforcement

the state systems occurred on or before December 31, 2010.

(1) The surviving spouse of any such sworn commissioned law enforcement officer of the office of state police of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections who is killed in the discharge of his duties, or dies from immediate effects of any injury received as the result of an act of violence occurring while engaged in the discharge of his duties, shall be pensioned at receive a survivor benefit equal to seventy-five percent of the salary being received by the employee at the time of the decedent's death or injury, provided the surviving spouse was married to the decedent at the time of the event which resulted in the officer's death.

(2) The surviving spouse of any such sworn commissioned law enforcement officer of the office of state police of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections who is killed by an intentional act of violence in the discharge of his duties, or dies from immediate effects of any injury received as the result of an intentional act of violence occurring while engaged in the discharge of his duties, shall receive a survivor benefit equal to one hundred percent of the salary being received by the employee at the time of the decedent's death or injury, provided the surviving spouse was married to the decedent at the time of the event which resulted in the officer's death.

- B. Notwithstanding the forfeiture provisions of R.S. 11:1321, the pension benefit of a surviving spouse covered by Subsection A of this Section shall be paid until the death of the surviving spouse.
- C.(1) If there is no surviving spouse of any state police employee whose death results from injury received in line of duty <u>covered by Subsection A of this</u>

  <u>Section</u>, then any surviving minor children shall <u>be pensioned receive the survivor</u>

  <u>benefit</u> at the amounts set forth in Subsection A of this Section.
- (2) As each minor child reaches eighteen years of age, or twenty-three years of age if a student, he shall receive no further benefits.
- D. Any surviving spouse of a member killed on or before June 29, 2017, by an intentional act of violence who would qualify for the survivor benefit

provided for in Paragraph (A)(2) of this Section shall have any survivor benefit payable on or after June 30, 2017, increased to the amount calculated pursuant to Paragraph (A)(2) of this Section regardless of the date of death of the member.

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## §1345.8. Survivors' benefit for members killed in the line of duty; death by an intentional act of violence

A. If a member's death occurs in the line of duty or is a direct result of an injury sustained while in the line of duty, survivor benefits shall be payable to qualified survivors as provided for in this Section, except that a survivor shall be eligible for benefits under this Section without regard to the amount of time that the surviving spouse was married to the deceased member and without regard to the amount of time that the deceased was a member of this plan. This benefit is payable only if the injury or injuries were sustained while on active duty status.

B.(1) If the member has a surviving spouse, **a** child or children who are minors, have a disability, or are mentally incapacitated, **or both a surviving spouse and a child or children**, the amount of the total benefit shall equal eighty percent of the member's average compensation. The benefit shall be shared equally by the surviving spouse and **any** children. When a child who neither has a disability nor is mentally incapacitated no longer meets the definition of minor child under R.S. 11:1301, his benefit shall cease, and the remaining beneficiaries shall have their shares adjusted accordingly.

(2) If the member has a surviving spouse, a child or children who are minors, have a disability, or are mentally incapacitated, or both a surviving spouse and a child or children, and the member is killed by an intentional act of violence or dies as a direct result of an injury sustained as a consequence of an intentional act of violence, the amount of the total benefit shall equal one hundred percent of the member's salary at the time of death. The benefit shall be shared equally by the surviving spouse and any children. When a child who

1 neither has a disability nor is mentally incapacitated no longer meets the 2 definition of minor child under R.S. 11:1301, his benefit shall cease, and the remaining beneficiaries shall have their shares adjusted accordingly. 3 C. This Act shall become effective on June 30, 2017; if vetoed by the 17 governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on 18 19 June 30, 2017, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the survivor benefit for the spouse and children of any sworn commissioned law enforcement officer of the office of state police, who was first eligible for the Louisiana State Police Retirement System (LSPRS) on or before December 31, 2010, and who was killed in the line of duty or dies from immediate effects of an injury received while in the line of duty. <u>Present law</u> provides that the benefit shall be equal to 75% of the salary received by the officer at the time of death and shall be paid until the death of the surviving spouse notwithstanding any forfeiture provisions in <u>present law</u> (R.S. 11:1321).

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the survivor benefit for the spouse and children of any sworn commissioned law enforcement officer of the office of state police, who was first eligible for the LSPRS on or before December 31, 2010, and who was killed in the line of duty by an intentional act of violence. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the benefit shall be equal to 100% of the salary received by the officer at the time of death and shall be paid until the death of

the surviving spouse notwithstanding any forfeiture provisions in present law (R.S. 11:1321).

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any surviving spouse of a member who was first eligible for the LSPRS on or before December 31, 2010, killed on or before June 29, 2017, by an intentional act of violence who would qualify for the survivor benefit provided for in <u>proposed law</u> shall have any survivor benefit payable on or after June 30, 2017, increased to the amount calculated pursuant to proposed law regardless of the date of death of the member.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the survivor benefit for the spouse and children of any sworn commissioned law enforcement officer of the office of state police who was first eligible for the LSPRS on or after January 1, 2011, and who was killed in the line of duty or died from immediate effects of an injury received while in the line of duty. <u>Present law</u> provides that the benefit shall be equal to 80% of the officer's average compensation without regard to the amount of time that the deceased was a member of the plan.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the survivor benefit for the spouse and children of any sworn commissioned law enforcement officer of the office of state police who was first eligible for the LSPRS on or after January 1, 2011, and who was killed in the line of duty by an intentional act of violence. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the benefit shall be equal to 100% of the officer's salary without regard to the amount of time that the deceased was a member of the plan.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that any surviving spouse of a member who was first eligible for the LSPRS on or after January 1, 2011, killed on or before June 29, 2017, by an intentional act of violence who would qualify for the survivor benefit provided for in <u>proposed law</u> shall have any survivor benefit payable on or after June 30, 2017, increased to the amount calculated pursuant to proposed law regardless of the date of death of the member.

<u>Proposed law</u> makes technical changes to clarify that the survivor benefit shall be paid until the death of the surviving spouse notwithstanding any forfeiture provisions in <u>present law</u> (R.S. 11:1321).

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the LSPRS board of trustees shall electronically notify all members of the legislature when a survivor benefit is granted pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> (R.S. 11:1316(A)(2) or R.S. 11:1345.8(A)(2).
