7	Section 1. R.S. 3:3246(D)(3) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:		
8	§3246. Certification and licensing of agricultural consultants

10	D. No new applications for an agricultural consultant's certificate shall be		
11	accepted unless the applicant furnishes satisfactory evidence that he meets the		
12	following requirements:

14	(3) He has earned at least four three hours of college credit in each discipline		
15	area for which certification is sought. The four discipline areas requiring		
16	certification are entomology, plant pathology, weed science, and soil science.

Abstract: Decreases the amount of college credit needed for certification and licensing of agricultural consultants.

<u>Present law</u> requires new applicants for an agricultural consultant's certificate to furnish satisfactory evidence that they have earned at least four hours of college credit in each discipline area for which certification is sought.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by reducing the amount of college credit <u>from</u> four hours <u>to</u> three hours.
