10	Section 1. R.S. 11:186(A) and (C) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as

12	§186. Authorization for staff to attend executive sessions
13	A. As ex officio members of each of the state and statewide retirement
14	system boards, the The chairman of the House Committee on Retirement and the
15	chairman of the Senate Committee on Retirement may each independently authorize
16	legislative staff to attend any executive session of any board meeting or committee
17	meeting of any state or statewide retirement system board or committee.

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 attorney-client privilege. as they relate to any information or communication that is

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 provided to or presented in the presence of such legislative staff in executive session.

Abstract: Allows the chairmen of the House and Senate committees on retirement, even if they are not members of the system boards, to authorize legislative staff to attend executive sessions of the board and committee meetings of the state and statewide retirement systems.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the chairmen of the House Committee on Retirement and the Senate Committee on Retirement, as ex officio members of the state and statewide retirement system boards, may authorize legislative staff to attend executive sessions of any board or committee meeting of the state or statewide retirement systems. <u>Proposed law</u> removes language specifying that this authority of the chairmen is exercised in their capacity as ex officio members of the state and statewide retirement system boards.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Retirement</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

1. Remove provisions placing the chairman of the House Committee on Retirement rather than a member of the committee on the 13 state and statewide retirement system boards.
