AGED PERSONS/AGING COUNC: Requires the Jefferson Council on Aging to provide certain levels of services at specified community and senior centers

AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 46:1608(G) and 1608.1, relative to the Jefferson Council on Aging; to provide 3 for allocation of services funded with monies appropriated to the council; to require 4 the council to provide for and fund certain services to be delivered at designated 5 centers; to establish conditions for the allocation of such services; to authorize the provision of certain services for residents age sixty or over; to prohibit the 6 7 displacement, replacement, or supplanting of other monies with funding for such 8 services; and to provide for related matters. 9 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published 10 as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of 11 Louisiana. 12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 13 Section 1. R.S. 46:1608(G) and 1608.1 are hereby enacted to read as follows: 14 §1608. Senior centers; appropriation; allocation of funds; Rapides Parish area 15 agency parish-specific provisions 16 17 G. The Jefferson Council on Aging shall allocate services in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 46:1608.1 among centers in the parish of Jefferson at which 18 19 activities and services for residents age sixty or over are provided.

3	A. Subject to the conditions provided in Subsection B of this Section, the

5	shall ensure delivery of a minimum level of services at the following centers within
6	the set of services to be funded with monies disbursed pursuant to R.S. 46:1608:
7	(1) The Harvey Community Center.
8	(2) The Marrero Community and Senior Center.
9	(3) The Woodmere Community Center.
10	B.(1) The council shall allocate funding for services at a center designated
11	in Subsection A of this Section only if the center has a contract, cooperative
12	endeavor agreement, memorandum of understanding, or other agreement in effect
13	with at least one nonprofit service provider which provides activities, programs, and
14	services for residents age sixty and over at the primary location of the center.
15	(2)(a) Subject to the provisions of Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph, the
16	council shall provide for services to be provided at each center designated in
17	Subsection A of this Section as requested by the director of the center.
18	(b) The council shall provide for and fund all services requested by the
19	director of a center until the value of the services provided for and funded pursuant
20	to this Paragraph at the center reaches ten thousand dollars in a fiscal year.
21	However, the council may fund additional services requested by a center director
22	pursuant to Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph subject to the approval of the
23	governing body of the council.
24	(3) The services provided pursuant to this Section shall be for residents age
25	sixty or over exclusively, and may include, without limitation, any of the following:

Abstract: Requires the Jefferson Council on Aging to provide certain levels of services, for residents age 60 and over, at specified community and senior centers.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Jefferson Council on Aging (council) to ensure that certain minimum levels of services for seniors, those services that are provided at senior centers pursuant to <u>present law</u> (R.S. 46:1608), are also provided at the following centers:

- (1) The Harvey Community Center.
- (2) The Marrero Community and Senior Center.
- (3) The Woodmere Community Center.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the council to provide such services to a center specified in <u>proposed law</u> only if the center has an agreement with at least one nonprofit service provider that provides activities, programs, and services for residents age 60 and over at the primary location of the center.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the council to provide for and fund all services requested by the director of a center until the value of the services provided for and funded reaches \$10,000 in a fiscal year. Authorizes the council to fund additional services requested by a center director subject to the approval of the governing body of the council.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the services provided by the council be for residents age 60 and over and that such services may include:

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Municipal, Parochial</u> and Cultural Affairs to the original bill:

- 1. Change <u>proposed law</u> such that it requires that the council provide for and fund services at the designated centers rather than requiring the council to allocate funds to the centers.
- 2. Add requirement that services be provided at the request of a center's director, up to the specified limit, and add authorization for the governing body of the council to fund additional services.
