Present law provides that parties may obtain discovery in civil proceedings via mental and physical examinations. Present law provides that the court may order an examination of a person whose mental or physical capacity is in controversy for good cause shown. Proposed law adds references to such examinations as "compulsory" in the cases of workplace fitness disputes, medical disability disputes, and domestic abuse cases. Proposed law is effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of gubernatorial action.
