1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 3:2364 and 2366(A), (B), (C), (D)(introductory paragraph), and
3	(E)(introductory paragraph) and (1), and R.S. 47:120.71(section heading) and (A)
4	and to repeal R.S. 3:2365, relative to the Louisiana Animal Control Advisory Task
5	Force; to provide for the creation of the Louisiana Animal Control Advisory Task
6	Force; to provide for task force membership and terms of office; to provide for the
7	powers and duties of the state veterinarian in relation to the task force; to provide for
8	the Louisiana Animal Shelter Registry; to provide for the Louisiana Animal Welfare
9	Commission income tax checkoff; and to provide for related matters.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 3:2364 and 2366 (A), (B), (C), (D)(introductory paragraph), and
12	(E)(introductory paragraph) and (1) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
13	§2364. Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission Louisiana Animal Control Advisory
14	Task Force
15	A. Definition. For purposes of this Section, "animal" shall mean dogs and
16	cats.
17	B. Creation and membership. (1) The Louisiana Animal Welfare
18	Commission is hereby created within the office of the governor for the purpose of
19	assisting the governor's office of community programs to ensure and promote the
20	proper treatment and well-being of animals. The commission shall receive no direct

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1	funding from the state, but may receive incidental services from state agencies in
2	order to carry out its purpose.
3	(2) Members of the commission shall serve four-year terms and shall not
4	receive any compensation or reimbursement of expenses. Each member of the
5	commission shall hold office until the appointment and qualification of his
6	successor. Whenever a vacancy occurs in an appointed position, the vacancy shall
7	be filled in the same manner and under the same terms and conditions as required for
8	the original appointment. The commission shall meet at the call of the chairman at
9	least quarterly and more often if necessary.
10	(3) The executive director of the governor's office of community programs
11	or his designee shall be a member of the commission. Other members of the
12	commission shall be appointed by the governor in accordance with the following
13	provisions:
14	(a) One representative of the Louisiana Department of Health.
15	(b) One small animal veterinarian, appointed at large.
16	(c) One member who is a director of a public animal control agency.
17	(d) One commercial breeder of dogs.
18	(e) Three representatives from separately operating humane societies or
19	private animal shelters.
20	(f) One representative from the Louisiana State Police.
21	(g) One member of the public, appointed at large.
22	(h) Two representatives appointed from a list of five nominations submitted
23	by the Louisiana Veterinary Medical Association.
24	(i) One representative of the Louisiana Quarterhorse Association.
25	(j) One representative of the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders Association.
26	(4) The governor shall appoint the initial chairman and initial vice chairman
27	of the commission from members appointed by the governor. Thereafter, the
28	members shall elect the chairman and vice chairman every odd-numbered year.
29	(5) The domicile of the commission shall be in East Baton Rouge Parish.

1	C. Transaction of business. A majority of the membership shall constitute
2	a quorum for the transaction of official business. All official actions of the
3	commission shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the
4	commission.
5	D. Duties and functions. The commission shall have powers and duties
6	necessary to carry out its purpose, including but not limited to the following:
7	(1) To support local and municipal animal control enforcement efforts.
8	(2) To support law enforcement in the investigation and prosecution of
9	animal cruelty cases.
10	(3) To make recommendations concerning the care and keeping of animals.
11	(4) To coordinate a statewide voluntary pet database that will assist animal
12	owners in recovering lost animals.
13	(5) To provide a centralized public animal information, education, and
14	communication service.
15	(6) To formulate and implement proposals to deal with pet overpopulation.
16	(7) To make recommendations for rules and regulations, which may be
17	adopted by parish and local authorities for the proper care and treatment of animals.
18	(8) To gather information from public records pertaining to the animals
19	within the purview of the commission. The government custodians of such records
20	shall make them accessible to the commission upon request under the provisions of
21	R.S. 44:1 et seq.
22	(9) To inspect any animal impoundment facility for the purpose of making
23	recommendations to the appropriate governing authority for improvements to those
24	facilities and their operations wherever such facilities are operated by a government
25	animal control agency or designated by municipal or parish governments to be used
26	for the purpose of impoundment of animals. The governing authority shall provide
27	to the commission reasonable access to the facility, its records, and personnel within
28	seven days of receipt of a written request.

1	(10) To request, in the form of a letter to the appropriate governing authority,
2	an animal control agency to produce public records pertaining to animal intake,
3	adoption, and euthanasia.
4	(11) To establish and maintain the Louisiana Animal Shelter Registry.
5	E. Louisiana Animal Welfare Fund. (1) The commission may accept and
6	solicit advice, services, and donations. Donations shall be remitted immediately to
7	the state treasury. After compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section
8	9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and Redemption
9	Fund, the monies shall be deposited in the Louisiana Animal Welfare Fund,
10	hereinafter referred to as the "fund", which is hereby created within the state treasury
11	and shall be used solely to carry out the functions and duties of the Louisiana Animal
12	Welfare Commission.
13	(2) The commission shall maintain a checking account in a Louisiana
14	licensed banking establishment for holding and distributing money that may be
15	transferred from the fund to be used by the commission in fulfillment of its purposes.
16	The checking account shall be entitled "Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission".
17	It shall be held jointly in the names of the current chairman and treasurer of the
18	commission. All checks shall require joint signatures.
19	(3) The treasurer of the state of Louisiana shall transfer monies from the fund
20	upon receiving a written order signed by the chairman and treasurer of the
21	commission. If the funds are insufficient to meet the full amount of the order, the
22	treasurer of the state of Louisiana may transfer the remaining balance in the fund.
23	The transfer of monies in the fund to the commission's checking account shall be
24	made within five business days of receiving the written order.
25	(4) The financial records of the commission shall be maintained by the
26	treasurer of the commission. A copy of the records, jointly certified by the treasurer
27	and the chairman, shall be provided by the chairman to the legislative auditor for
28	inspection within twenty business days of the close of the state's fiscal year. The
29	legislative auditor shall report the findings of the inspection to the governor and the

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1	chairman of the commission within ninety days of receiving the certified copy of the
2	records.
3	A. For purposes of this Section, the term "animal" shall mean a dog or cat.
4	B. The Louisiana Animal Control Advisory Task Force is hereby created
5	within the office of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry under the
6	direction of the state veterinarian for the purpose of assisting community programs
7	in ensuring and promoting the proper treatment and well-being of animals. The task
8	force shall consist of the following six members to be appointed by the
9	commissioner of agriculture:
10	(1) One member who is a small animal veterinarian.
11	(2) One member who is a director of a public animal control agency.
12	(3) One individual from the public at large.
13	(4) One representative from the Louisiana Animal Control Association.
14	(5) One representative from the Louisiana Veterinary Medical Association.
15	(6) The state veterinarian.
16	C. The state veterinarian shall have the powers and duties necessary to carry
17	out its purpose, including but not limited to the following:
18	(1) Support local and municipal animal control enforcement efforts.
19	(2) Support law enforcement in the investigation and prosecution of animal
20	cruelty cases.
21	(3) Make recommendations concerning the care and keeping of animals.
22	(4) Coordinate a statewide voluntary pet database that will assist animal
23	owners in recovering lost animals.
24	(5) Formulate and implement proposals to deal with animal overpopulation.
25	(6) Promulgate rules and regulations that may be adopted by parish and local
26	authorities for the proper care and treatment of animals.
27	(7) Inspect animal impoundment facilities for the purpose of making
28	recommendations to the appropriate governing authority for improvements to those
29	facilities and their operations wherever such facilities are operated by a government

1	animal control agency or designated by municipal or parish governments to be used
2	for the purpose of impoundment of animals. The governing authority shall provide
3	the state veterinarian, or his designee, with reasonable access to the facility, and
4	access to its records, and personnel within seven days of receipt of a written request.
5	(8) Submit written request to the appropriate governing authority to have its
6	animal control agency produce public records pertaining to animal intake, adoption,
7	and euthanasia.
8	D. The task force shall act in an advisory capacity to the state veterinarian
9	and report activities periodically.
10	E.(1) Members of the task force shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing
11	authority.
12	(2) The task force shall meet at least once per calendar year. Additional
13	special or regular meetings may be held upon the call of the chairman.
14	(3) Task force members shall serve without compensation.
15	F. If the department does not receive the necessary funds, incurs a reduction
16	in funds, or receives insufficient monies to fund or continue the program, the
17	program shall become inactive.
18	§2365. Louisiana Pet Registry
19	A. The Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission shall establish and maintain
20	a voluntary registry for animals called the Louisiana Pet Registry. The current owner
21	of any animal may register that animal with the commission.
22	B.(1) The registration shall include the name and address of the owner and
23	the name and a description of the animal. If the animal has been fitted with a
24	microchip, the registration shall also include the brand of commercial microchip and
25	the animal's microchip identification number. If the animal is tattooed with an
26	identification number, the registration shall include the tattoo number.
27	(2) The commission shall assign to each registered animal a unique
28	identification number and provide to the owner of each registered animal a license
29	tag bearing the identification number.

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1	(3) The manner in which the license number is affixed to the registered
2	animal is at the discretion of the owner.
3	(4) The owner of each registered animal shall notify the commission of any
4	changes in registration information within thirty days.
5	C. The owner of each registered animal shall pay a fee of fifteen dollars to
6	the commission for the registration of that animal.
7	D. Fees shall be paid directly to the commission and deposited into the
8	Louisiana Animal Welfare Fund for use by the commission. The commission may
9	waive or reduce fees if it deems necessary.
10	E. Applications for registration with the Louisiana Pet Registry shall be
11	made available by the commission. The commission shall provide public notices
12	pertaining to the registry.
13	§2366. Louisiana Animal Shelter Registry
14	A. The legislature finds that the establishment and maintenance of a
15	voluntary animal shelter registry will enable the Louisiana Animal Welfare
16	Commission Louisiana Animal Control Advisory Task Force to carry out its duties.
17	B. As used in this Section, the following terms are defined as follows: the
18	term
19	(1) "Commission" means the Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission.
20	(2) "Public animal shelter" "public animal shelter" means an animal shelter
21	owned, operated, or designated for the purpose of impoundment of animals by any
22	parish, municipality, or other subdivision of the state.
23	C. The commission state veterinarian shall establish and maintain a registry
24	for animal shelters called the Louisiana Animal Shelter Registry.
25	D. On or before the first day of February of each calendar year, each parish
26	governing authority may submit to the commission state veterinarian a list of all
27	public animal shelters located within the parish's jurisdiction. The list shall include:

1	E. On or before the first day of February of each calendar year, each public
2	animal shelter may submit the following to the commission state veterinarian:
3	(1) The Basic Animal Data Matrix, submitted as "transparent" data, to the
4	Shelter Animals Count database found at http://www.shelteranimalscount.org. Public
5	animal shelters may submit the matrix electronically through this website or fill it out
6	manually and mail it to the commission, which will input the data on behalf of the
7	shelter.

9	Section 2. R.S. 47:120.71(section heading) and (A) are hereby amended and
10	reenacted to read as follows:
11	§120.71. Income tax checkoff; donation for Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission
12	Louisiana Pet Overpopulation Advisory Council; creation; use of monies
13	A. Every individual who files an individual income tax return for the current
14	tax year and who is entitled to a refund may designate on his current-year return that
15	all or any portion of the total amount of the refund to which he is entitled shall be
16	donated to the Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission Louisiana Pet Overpopulation
17	Advisory Council in lieu of that amount being paid to him as a refund, in which case
18	the refund shall be reduced by the amount so designated. The designation shall be
19	made at the time of the filing of the current-year tax return and shall be made upon
20	the income tax return form as provided by the secretary of the Department of
21	Revenue. No donation made under the provisions of this Subsection shall be invalid
22	for lack of an authentic act.

24	Section 3. R.S. 3:2365 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

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Abstract: Modifies provisions of law providing for the La. Animal Welfare Commission and the La. Animal Shelter Registry, and repeals the La. Pet Registry.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the La. Animal Welfare Commission (commission), which assists the governor's office of community programs with ensuring and promoting the proper treatment and well-being of animals by supporting local and municipal animal control efforts, making recommendations concerning the care and keeping of animals, and establishing the La. Animal Welfare Fund to be used solely to carry out the functions and duties of the commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by removing provisions relative to the creation, membership, inspection authority, public records request authority, and funding relative to the commission and instead creates the La. Animal Control Advisory Task Force under the direction of the state veterinarian within the Dept. of Agriculture and Forestry to ensure and promote the proper treatment and well-being of animals.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that the task force shall consist of six members appointed by the commissioner as follows: one member who is a small animal veterinarian, one member who is a director of a public animal control agency, one individual from the public at large, one representative from the La. Animal Control Assoc., one representative from the La. Veterinary Medical Assoc., and the state veterinarian. Specifies that the members serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Specifies that members must serve without compensation. Further requires the task force act in an advisory capacity to the state veterinarian and report activities periodically.

<u>Proposed law</u> empowers the state veterinarian to carry out its purpose, including but not limited to the following: support local and municipal animal control efforts; support law enforcement in the investigation and prosecution of animal cruelty cases; make recommendations concerning the care and keeping of animals; coordinate a statewide pet database; formulate and implement proposals to deal with animal overpopulation; promulgate rules and regulations which may be adopted by parish and local authorities for the proper care and treatment of animals; inspect any animal impoundment facilities for the purpose of making recommendations for improvement to those facilities and their operations to the appropriate governing authority under certain circumstances; and request any animal control agency to produce public records pertaining to animal intake, adoption, and euthanasia.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if the department does not receive the necessary funds or receives insufficient monies to fund the program, the program will become inactive.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the La. Animal Shelter Registry, a voluntary animal shelter registry used by the commission to carry out its duties by requiring each parish to submit to the commission a list of all public animal shelters located within the parish's jurisdiction.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by removing the commission and replacing it with the La. Animal Control Task Force, removing the definition of commission and any references to commission in <u>present law</u>, and removing the option granted to public animal shelters that allows them to manually fill out the basic animal data matrix and mail it in.

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<u>Present law</u> provides for the La. Pet Registry. Requires the commission to establish and maintain a voluntary registry for animals, and provides that the current owner of any animal may register that animal with the commission. Further provides registration requirements, registration identification numbers, animal license tags and procedures for affixing the tag to the registered animal, notification of animal registration by the owner to the commission, a registration fee, directions for where the fees should be deposited, and where applications for registration and public notices pertaining to the registry must be provided.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that an individual may donate all or a portion of his income tax refund to the La. Animal Welfare Commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by changing the La. Animal Welfare Commission to the La. Pet Overpopulation Advisory Council for purposes of income tax refund donation.

(Amends R.S. 3:2364 and 2366(A), (B), (C), (D)(intro. para.), and (E)(intro. para.) and (1) and R.S. 47:120.71(section heading) and (A); Repeals R.S. 3:2365)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Agriculture, Forestry,</u> <u>Aquaculture, and Rural Development to the original bill:</u>

- 1. Make technical changes.
- 2. Increase the membership on the La. Animal Control Advisory Task Force from five to six.
- 3. Replace the private animal shelter member on the task force with an individual from the public at large.
- 4. Add the state veterinarian to the task force.
- 5. Clarify that the governing authority of an animal impoundment facility grants the state veterinarian access to its records and personnel within seven days of receipt of a written request.
- 6. Repeal requirements relative to the La. Pet Registry and remove any references to the law.
- 7. Add the La. Animal Shelter Registry to proposed law and change reference to the La. Animal Welfare Commission to the La. Animal Control Advisory Task Force.
- 8. Remove the definition of commission and any reference to the commission under the La. Animal Shelter Registry law.
- 9. Change the La. Animal Welfare Commission to the La. Pet Overpopulation Advisory Council for income tax refund donation purposes.
