Abstract: Requires the Jefferson Council on Aging to provide certain levels of services, for residents age 60 and over, at specified community and senior centers.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Jefferson Council on Aging (council) to ensure that certain minimum levels of services for seniors, those services that are provided at senior centers pursuant to <u>present law</u> (R.S. 46:1608), are also provided at the following centers:

- (1) The Harvey Community Center.
- (2) The Marrero Community and Senior Center.
- (3) The Woodmere Community Center.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the council to fund such services to a center specified in <u>proposed law</u> from monies disbursed to it pursuant to <u>present law</u> (R.S. 46:1608) or another funding source.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the council to provide such services to a center specified in <u>proposed law</u> only if a nonprofit service provider that provides activities, programs, and services for residents age 60 and over at the primary location of the center has entered into a contract with Jefferson Parish.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the council to provide services at each center specified in <u>proposed law</u> until the value of the services provided for and funded reaches \$10,000 in a fiscal year.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the services provided by the council be for residents age 60 and over and that such services may include:

- (1) A senior prescription program providing low-cost or free prescription medications to seniors.
- (2) A senior health insurance information program.
- (3) Aging and disability resources.
- (4) The following special services for seniors:
 - (a) Care management including, without limitation, personal care and respite care services.

- (b) Homemaker services.
- (c) Legal resources and services.
- (d) Educational services.
- (e) Nutrition services.
- (f) Transportation services.

(Adds R.S. 46:1608(G) and 1608.1)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Municipal, Parochial and</u> Cultural Affairs to the original bill:

- 1. Change <u>proposed law</u> such that it requires that the council provide for and fund services at the designated centers rather than requiring the council to allocate funds to the centers.
- 2. Add requirement that services be provided at the request of a center's director, up to the specified limit, and add authorization for the governing body of the council to fund additional services.

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Authorize the council to use other funding sources to fund services provided pursuant to proposed law.
- 2. Remove requirement that a center, prior to receiving services pursuant to <u>proposed law</u>, enter into an agreement with a nonprofit service provider that provides services at the center and instead require the nonprofit service provider to enter into a contract with Jefferson Parish.
- 3. Remove requirement that the council provide services as requested by the director of the center.
- 4. Remove authorization for the governing body of the council to fund additional services.
