TAX/AD VALOREM TAX: Requires reports to the assessor concerning deaths occurring in the state

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

1. Limits disclosure of the social security number to the last four digits.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present constitution</u> and <u>present law</u> require each assessor to maintain lists of property for purposes of ad valorem taxation.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the state registrar of vital records is the custodian of all vital certificates and records in this state.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and requires, by the 10th day of each month, the state registrar of vital records to send to each assessor a certified report containing the name, address, date of birth, sex, and last four digits of the social security number, as such information exists in the database of the La. Dept. of Health, of any person 16 years of age or older who died in the state within the preceding calendar month. Further authorizes the format and method of transmission of the report to be determined by the registrar of vital records.
