## HOUSE SUMMARY OF SENATE AMENDMENTS

## HB 324 2017 Regular Session Pierre

RAILROADS: Adds on track equipment as a railway vehicle considered for certain railroad crossing requirements

## **Synopsis of Senate Amendments**

1. Clarifies that a collision or interference with the movement of a train or other on-track equipment may be, prima facie evidence of the driver's failure to yield if it is unrebutted.

## Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> provides for "obedience to signal indicating approach to train".

<u>Proposed law</u> clarifies that obedience to signal indicating approach to train refers to motor vehicles approaching railroad crossings.

<u>Present law</u> requires all motor vehicle operators to take certain precautions when approaching a railroad train.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds on-track equipment as a railway vehicle that a motor vehicle driver must be cautious of when approaching railroad tracks.

Present law requires the railroad to operate its trains in a safe manner.

<u>Proposed law</u> clarifies that the railroad is responsible for operating its trains and other ontrack equipment in a safe manner.

<u>Present law</u> specifies that if a driver is involved in a collision at a railroad crossing or interferes with the movement of a train or other on-track equipment after driving past the railroad cross buck sign, the collision or interference is prima facie evidence of the driver's failure to yield the right of way.

<u>Proposed law</u> clarifies that the collision or interference referenced in <u>present law</u> may be, prima facie evidence of the driver's failure to yield if it is unrebutted.
