



- (3) Placed at locations that are readily visible to any person approaching the property and no more than 100 feet apart on forest land, as defined in present law, or 1,000 feet apart on land other than forest land.

Present law provides that no person can incite, solicit, urge, encourage, exhort, instigate, or procure any other person to go into or upon or to remain in or upon any structure, watercraft, or any other movable, that belongs to another, knowing that such other person has been forbidden to go or remain there, either orally or in writing, including by means of any sign, by the owner, lessee, or custodian of the property or by any other authorized person. For the purposes of present law, "sign" means a sign or signs posted on or in the structure, watercraft, or any other movable, where such sign or signs may be reasonably expected to be seen.

Proposed law retains present law and further defines "sign" to mean the placement of identifying purple paint marks on the trees or posts on the property, provided that such marks are:

- (1) Vertical lines of not less than eight inches in length and not less than one inch in width.
- (2) Placed so that the bottom of the mark is not less than three feet from the ground nor more than five feet from the ground.
- (3) Placed at locations that are readily visible to any person approaching the property and no more than 100 feet apart on forest land, as defined in present law, or 1,000 feet apart on land other than forest land.
