Abstract: Creates an exception for the sale and use of motor vehicles for which a certificate of destruction has been issued.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits a motor vehicle issued a certificate of destruction from being issued a salvage or reconstructed title or from being titled or registered by the office of motor vehicles for use on the roads or highways of this state.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits a motor vehicle issued a certificate of destruction from being resold as a retail unit and requires such vehicle be dismantled, sold for any usable parts, or crushed.

<u>Proposed law</u> maintains <u>present law</u> but authorizes the use or resale of the motor vehicle issued a certificate of destruction if the vehicle passes a physical inspection performed by a full-time certified law enforcement officer who is trained and certified by the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police, to inspect motor vehicles.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits a law enforcement officer from conducting an inspection of a vehicle in which he has a fiduciary interest or an ownership interest, or is in the process of acquiring an interest through a company or entity in which he has a fiduciary interest.
