SCHOOLS/FINANCE-MFP: Provides relative to funding for university laboratory schools

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:350.21, relative to funding of laboratory schools; to provide
3	relative to inclusion of University of Louisiana at Lafayette as a public
4	postsecondary education institution eligible to receive state funding for a laboratory
5	school; to provide for the allocation of funds attributable to such inclusion; and to
6	provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 17:350.21 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
9	§350.21. University laboratory schools operated by Louisiana State University and
10	Agricultural and Mechanical College and by, Southern University and
11	Agricultural and Mechanical College, and University of Louisiana at
12	<u>Lafayette</u> ; funding formula
13	A. Any elementary or secondary school operated by Louisiana State
14	University and Agricultural and Mechanical College or, by Southern University and
15	Agricultural and Mechanical College, or University of Louisiana at Lafayette shall
16	be considered a public elementary or secondary school and, as such, shall be
17	annually appropriated funds as determined by applying the formula contained as
18	specified in Subsection B of this Section.
19	B. Each student, as identified by the preceding year's October first
20	membership, at the enrolled in a schools school provided for in Subsection A of this

Section shall be provided for and funded as provided for in Article VIII, Section 13
of the Constitution of Louisiana. The State Board of Elementary and Secondary
Education shall allocate annually from the minimum foundation program formula
an amount per student in to each school equal to the amount allocated per student to
the East Baton Rouge Parish School Board school board in the parish where the
school is located.
C. The funds appropriated for the schools provided for in this Section shall
be allocated to the institution of higher postsecondary education operating such a the
school. Each such, and each institution of higher education shall expend such funds
to operate such schools the school.
D. The funds provided pursuant to the provisions of this Section during any
one fiscal year shall not supplant funding provided by a higher postsecondary
education institution for the previous fiscal year to any elementary or secondary
school operated by the institution.
E. Notwithstanding any provision of this Section to the contrary, the funding
provided pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall not exceed the average per
pupil funding provided by the minimum foundation program formula for other
elementary or secondary schools operated by public postsecondary education

Abstract: Adds University of Louisiana at Lafayette to institutions eligible to receive laboratory school funding through the minimum foundation program.

<u>Present law</u> provides that an elementary or secondary school operated by a public postsecondary institution, hereafter called "laboratory school", is considered as part of the parish school system where the laboratory school is located for the purposes of inclusion in the minimum foundation program and formula. Requires BESE to include all such students in the development and application of the minimum foundation formula.

<u>Present law</u> requires the state Dept. of Education to allocate funds appropriated for laboratory schools to the public postsecondary education institution operating such school.

Requires that each such institution budget and allocate such funds to the operation of such schools.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> is applicable to Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College and Southern University and Agricultural and Mechanical College laboratory schools. <u>Proposed law</u> retains present law, but further provides for applicability to University of Louisiana at Lafayette laboratory school.
