LAW ENFORCE/OFFICERS: Requires additional training for peace officers

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:2405.8(E) and (F) and to enact R.S. 40:2405.8(G), relative
3	to peace officer training requirements; to provide for the creation of domestic
4	violence training modules; to provide for the creation of communication with deaf
5	and hard of hearing training modules; to provide relative to communication tools; to
6	provide for the promulgation of rules; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 40:2405.8(E) and (F) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
9	40:2405.8(G) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§2405.8. Additional peace officer training requirements
11	* * *
12	E.(1) The council shall develop a domestic violence awareness training
13	program in a series of modules to include all of the following:
14	(a) Dynamics of domestic violence.
15	(b) Predominate aggressor determination.
16	(c) Neurobiology of trauma and its implications for victim communication.
17	(d) Strangulation response and investigation methods.
18	(e) Evidence-based investigation methods.
19	(f) Protection order enforcement and the Louisiana Protective Order
20	Registry.

2	(2) On and after July 1, 2018, each peace officer, as defined in R.S.
3	40:2402(3)(a), shall complete a domestic violence awareness training program as
4	provided by the council.
5	F.(1) The council shall develop a communication with deaf and hard of
6	hearing individuals training program in a series of modules to include all of the
7	following:
8	(a) Recognition of deaf or hard of hearing individual.
9	(b) Communication tips including but not limited to the following:
10	(i) Review of the ADA publication, "Communicating with People Who Are
11	Deaf or Hard of Hearing: ADA Guide for Law Enforcement Officer".
12	(ii) Training with communication cards or other forms of assistance
13	technology for law enforcement officers interacting with deaf or hard of hearing
14	individuals.
15	(c) Information regarding how to access interpreters, TTY, and relay
16	services.
17	(d) Rights of deaf and hard of hearing individuals, including interrogations.
18	(e) Applicable state and federal laws.
19	(2) On and after July 1, 2018, each peace officer, as defined in R.S.
20	40:2402(3)(a), shall complete a training program as provided by the council on
21	communicating with deaf and hard of hearing individuals.
22	(3) The council shall approve communication cards developed by any public
23	or private entity, including nongovernmental advocacy groups, that specializes in
24	working with deaf and hard of hearing individuals for the use by law enforcement
25	officers. The communication cards should be made available in all law enforcement
26	agency headquarters and substations. Additionally, all officers shall have
27	communication cards available in patrol vehicles.
28	E.G.(1) The council shall promulgate rules and regulations in accordance
29	with the Administrative Procedure Act, subject to the oversight of the House

16	Administrative Procedures Act for implementation of the following training
17	programs for peace officers as provided in Subsections E and F of this Section:
18	(i) Domestic violence awareness training.
19	(ii) Communication with deaf or hard of hearing individuals.
20	(b) The council shall create and maintain a list of peace officers who have
21	successfully completed the domestic violence awareness training and the training on
22	communication with the deaf or hard of hearing individuals.

Abstract: Requires peace officers to attend domestic violence and communicating with deaf and hard of hearing individuals training, and requires the council to develop the training modules.

<u>Present law</u> requires the P.O.S.T. Council to create mandatory training for all peace officers to complete. The council is responsible for keeping track of the officers that attend or complete the training.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the council to create additional training modules for domestic violence and communicating with deaf and hard of hearing persons. Requires the council to utilize communication cards from a nongovernmental agency that specializes in working with deaf and hard of hearing individuals.

(Amends R.S. 40:2405.8(E) and (F); Adds R.S. 40:2405.8(G))
