Gatti

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the abolition of certain boards, commissions, authorities, and like entities; abolishes the functions and responsibilities of the entity, all as follows:

Health Education Authority of Louisiana: <u>Present law</u> provides that the authority will assist public and private institutions and organizations in the development of health care and education programs. Further the authority owns property in Orleans Parish. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the authority and provides for the transfer of the property to the state.

St. Tammany Event Center District: <u>Present law</u> creates the district to acquire, construct, and operate an events center and programs in St. Tammany Parish. Further provides for funding of the district. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the district and provides for the distribution of the funding.

Louisiana's I-12 Retirement District: <u>Present law</u> creates the district to research, study, develop, and implement plans and programs designed to promote the district as an area into which retirees or persons nearing retirement age may relocate. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the district.

Board of Morgan City, Berwick Port Pilot Commissioners and Examiners: <u>Present law</u> creates the board to regulate pilots, the Morgan City, Berwick Pilots Association, and masters and owners of vessels plying the navigable waters in the board's jurisdiction. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the board.

North Bossier Levee and Drainage District: <u>Present law</u> creates the district and provides for its jurisdictional boundaries. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the district.

Red River, Atchafalaya River, and Bayou Boeuf Gravity Drainage District: <u>Present law</u> creates the district to address the drainage problems affecting the geographical area located within the district. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the commission.

Bayou Desiard Lake Restoration Commission: <u>Present law</u> creates the commission to restore the management and protection of the water in certain portions of Bayou Desiard Lake. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the commission.

Jackson Parish Industrial District: <u>Present law</u> creates the district and provides for its membership. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the district and membership.

Point of Rescue Task Force a/k/a Task Force on Abortion Information: <u>Present law</u> creates the task force to assist in the preparation of printed and internet material for information on abortions. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the task force.

River Region Cancer Screening and Early Detection District: <u>Present law</u> creates the district to screen persons for cancer in its jurisdictional boundaries. <u>Present law</u> creates a prestige license plate for the district. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the district and removes the authority for the prestige license plate.

Parish Hospital Service District for Rapides Parish: <u>Present law</u> creates the district to construct or acquire a new general hospital facility in the parish or renovate an existing general hospital facility in the parish and provide for the operation of such facility. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the district.

Louisiana Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys: <u>Present law</u> creates the council to perform a systematic study of the conditions affecting black men and boys and to provide recommendations. <u>Proposed law</u> abolishes the council.

Louisiana Innovation Council: <u>Present law</u> creates the council with the mission to shape an innovation-based vision for Louisiana and coordinate activities in the statewide innovation agenda. <u>Proposed law abolishes the council</u>.
