Abstract: Establishes the State Commission on Prosecutorial Conduct to collect and report certain data from district attorney offices statewide.

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the State Commission on Prosecutorial Conduct and authorizes the commission to collect data from prosecutors and district attorneys statewide.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the composition of the commission and provides that a commission member shall not receive compensation for his services as a commission member, but shall be paid his expenses necessary to complete the duties of the position.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the commission to monitor district attorney-operated diversion programs statewide collecting and monitoring a variety of demographic data on the participants.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the commission to annually publish information collected from the prosecutors and district attorneys statewide and any conclusions reached from analyzing the collected data.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the posted information will not violate the privacy rights of any participant of a diversion program. The collected data shall be posted on the commission website.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the commission to adopt, promulgate, amend, and repeal rules and procedures, not otherwise consistent with law, necessary to carry out the provisions and purposes of <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the commission to present the annual report for the previous calendar year on or before the first day of April of each year. Further requires the commission to give a copy of the report to the governor, Senate, House of Representatives, and the La. Supreme Court.
