2	To enact R.S. 32:429.4(A)(5), relative to installment agreements for outstanding penalties,
3	fines, and fees; to provide for a hearing to adjudicate whether a person has the means

7	Section 1. R.S. $32:429.4(A)(5)$ is hereby enacted to read as follows:

12	(5) Prior to the implementation of any installment agreement to collect any
13	outstanding fees, penalties, or interest that is owed to the office of motor vehicles,
14	the person who receives a notification of outstanding penalties, fines, and fees from
15	the office of motor vehicles shall be granted a hearing to determine that person's
16	means or ability to pay.

Abstract: Requires a hearing to determine a person's means and ability to pay prior to entering into an installment agreement with the Dept. of Public Safety, office of motor vehicle for the payment of outstanding penalties, fines, or fees.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes a person to enter into an installment agreement with the Dept. of Public Safety, office of motor vehicles for the payment of outstanding penalties, fines, or fees owed to the office of motor vehicle.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a person receive a hearing to determine their means and ability to pay prior to entering into any installment agreement for the payment of outstanding penalties, fines, or fees owed to the office of motor vehicles.
