WILDLIFE & FISHERIES: Restructuring of hunting and fishing licenses

1 AN ACT 2 To amend and reenact R.S. 56:10(B)(1)(f) and (g), (5), (6), (7), (9), (10), (13), 103(A), (B), and (C), 109(D), 116(C)(1) and (D), 116.1(C)(3), 302, 302.1, 302.9(A)(1), 3 4 302.9.1(E), 302.10, 325.1(A)(1) and (3), and (C)(2)(d), 325.3(A)(1), 330(B), 500(A), 5 641(A), 649.1, 649.2, 649.3, 649.4, 649.7, to enact Subpart B of Part III of Chapter 6 I of Title 56 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 7 56:91 through 96, to enact R.S. 56:10 (16), 10.2, 678, and 679, and to repeal R.S. 8 56:10(B)(1)(d), 103(E) and (F), 103.1, 104, 105, 155, 156, 157, 164, 165, 166, 302.1, 9 302.2, 302.3, 302.4, 302.5, 302.6, 641.1, 642, 643, 646, 647.1, 649.5, 649.6, 650, 10 650.1, 1832, 1833, relative to licenses to hunt and fish; to restructure the recreational 11 hunting and fishing licensing system for the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; 12 to provide relative to the cost of hunting and fishing licenses; to dedicate revenues 13 from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses; and to provide for related matters. 14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 15 Section 1. R.S. 56:10(B)(1)(f) and (g), (5), (6), (7), (9), (10), (13), 103(A), (B), and 16 (C), 109(D), 116(C)(1) and (D), 116.1(C)(3), 302, 302.1, 302.9(A)(1), 302.9.1(E), 302.10, 17 325.1(A)(1) and (3), and (C)(2)(d), 325.3(A)(1), 330(B), 500(A), 641(A), 649.1, 649.2, 18 649.3, 649.4, 649.7 are hereby amended and reenacted, and Subpart B of Part III of Chapter 19 I of Title 56 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 56:91 20 through 96 and R.S. 56:10(16), 10.2, 678, and 679 are hereby enacted to read as follows:

6	(f) Pay annually into the Conservation Fund, an amount equal to the
7	additional charter fishing fees collected pursuant to R.S. 56:302.1(C)(2)(c) and
8	302.9(C)(2)(b) and paid into the treasury by the commission. There is hereby
9	created in the Conservation Fund, the Charter Boat Fishing Fund. Such funds Funds
10	deposited into the fund shall be used by the department for the promotion of the
11	charter boat industry, protection of the fishery, and to provide for administrative
12	costs of the fund. Such funds are to be expended for such purposes through the
13	Louisiana Charter Boat Association.
14	(g) Between June 1, 2014, and May 31, 2018, pay There is hereby created
15	in the Conservation Fund annually into the Conservation Fund, into a special account
16	designated as the "Saltwater Fish Research and Conservation Fund", an amount

19	(R.S. 56:10(B)(1)(d)) (5)(a) There is hereby created in the Conservation
20	Fund a special account known as the Louisiana Duck License, Stamp, and Print
21	Fund. The treasurer shall pay Pay annually into a special fund created in the state
22	treasury and designated as the Louisiana Duck License, Stamp, and Print Fund all
23	amounts received pursuant to the Louisiana Duck License, Stamp, and Print Program
24	provided for in R.S. 56:151 et seq. and such other funds as are specifically
25	appropriated by the legislature.
26	(b) The monies in the Louisiana Duck License, Stamp, and Print Fund shall
27	be used solely for the programs and purposes associated with the Louisiana Duck
28	License, Stamp, and Print Program as provided by R.S. 56:151 et seq. in the amounts

13	program revenues, to the North American Waterfowl Habitat Conservation Plan for
14	the purpose of acquiring, developing, or maintaining migratory waterfowl areas
15	within Louisiana.
16	(R.S.56:155(C)(2)) (f) To cover the administrative costs associated with the
17	implementation of the Louisiana Duck License, Stamp, and Print Program, not to
18	exceed five percent of the program revenues.

20	(6) (a) There is hereby created within the Conservation Fund a special
21	account known as the "natural heritage account" which shall consist of those
22	revenues collected from the sale of "Wild Louisiana" stamps and prints provided for
23	in R.S. 56:1832 and those funds donated or allocated for the protection and
24	stewardship of Louisiana's wild lands and waters to support the functions of the
25	Louisiana Natural Heritage Program. The revenues shall be subject to the same
26	requirements as provided for other revenues placed in the Conservation Fund in
27	Paragraph (1) of this Subsection. The funds in this account shall be used solely for
28	the implementation and administration of Parts I, II, III, and IV of Chapter 8 of this

Title and the natural heritage and nongame programs within the department.

1	(b)(i) Five percent of the net proceeds derived from the fifty dollar fee
2	imposed by R.S. 47:463.45(B) for the black bear prestige license plate shall be used
3	to promote the existence of the black bear prestige license plate and its availability
4	for use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, and vans.
5	(ii) Five percent of the net proceeds derived from the fifty dollar fee imposed
6	by R.S. 47:463.46(B) for the Louisiana Quail Forever prestige plate shall be used to
7	promote the existence of the Louisiana Quail Forever prestige plate and its
8	availability for use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, recreational vehicles, and vans.
9	(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of the law to the contrary, every
10	hunting and fishing license issued by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries shall
11	include a notice with a telephone number and mailing address for information on
12	how to acquire a black bear prestige license plate for use on one's passenger car,
13	pickup truck, or van.
14	(7)(a) There is hereby created in the Conservation Fund a special fund called
15	the Louisiana Wild Turkey Fund. The monies in the Louisiana Wild Turkey Fund
16	shall be used solely for the programs and purposes associated with the Louisiana
17	Wild Turkey Program as provided by R.S. 56:161 et seq. in the amounts appropriated
18	each year to the department by the legislature.
19	(b) The revenues collected from the sale of the Louisiana Wild Turkey
20	Federation license plate provided for in R.S. 47:463.54 shall be used solely for
21	turkey restocking and research purposes in the amounts appropriated each year to the
22	commission by the legislature, with the exception of five dollars per plate sold to be
23	used for the purpose of advertising the license plates.
24	(R.S. 56:164(B)) (c) Subject to appropriation, the monies in the Louisiana
25	Wild Turkey Fund shall be used:
26	(1) (i) To acquire lands in Louisiana which have the primary and direct
27	purpose of conserving, restoring, and enhancing wild turkey habitat.

1	(2) (ii) To carry out wild turkey habitat restoration and enhancement projects
2	on lands under the jurisdiction of the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and
3	Fisheries.
4	(3) (iii) To acquire lands that are suitable for wild turkeys and wild turkey
5	management.

7	(9)(a) There is hereby created within the Conservation Fund a special account
8	known as the "black bear account" which shall consist of those revenues collected
9	from the sale of the black bear unlimited license plates provided for in R.S.
10	47:463.45. The revenues shall be subject to the same requirements as provided for
11	other revenues placed in the Conservation Fund in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.
12	The funds in this account shall be used solely for the purpose of conserving,
13	restoring, and enhancing black bear habitat in Louisiana.
14	(R.S. 56:10(B)(6)(b)(i)) (b) Five percent of the net proceeds derived from the
15	fifty dollar fee imposed by R.S. 47:463.45(B) for the black bear prestige license plate
16	shall be used to promote the existence of the black bear prestige license plate and its
17	availability for use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, and vans.
18	(R.S. 56:10(B)(6)(b)(c)) (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of the law
19	to the contrary, every hunting and fishing license issued by the Department of
20	Wildlife and Fisheries shall include a notice with a telephone number and mailing
21	address for information on how to acquire a black bear prestige license plate for use
22	on one's passenger car, pickup truck, or van.
23	(10)(a) There is hereby created within the Conservation Fund a special
24	account known as the "quail account" which shall consist of those revenues collected
25	from the sale of the Louisiana Quail Forever license plates provided for in R.S.
26	47:463.46. The revenues shall be subject to the same requirements as provided for
27	other revenues placed in the Conservation Fund in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.
28	The funds in this account shall be used solely for the purpose of conserving,

restoring, and enhancing quail habitat in Louisiana.

$\frac{\text{(R.S. 56:10(6)(b)(ii))}}{\text{(b)}}$ Five percent of the net proceeds derived from the
fifty dollar fee imposed by R.S. 47:463.46(B) for the Louisiana Quail Forever
prestige plate shall be used to promote the existence of the Louisiana Quail Forever
prestige plate and its availability for use on passenger cars, pickup trucks,
recreational vehicles, and vans.

(13) There is hereby created within the Conservation Fund a special account known as the "Derelict Crab Trap Removal Program Account", which shall consist of funds received from revenues as provided in R.S. 56:302.3(B)(1) and (C) and 305(B)(2) and (C)(1), donations, and from any other source which may specify deposit to this account. The revenues in the account shall be subject to the same requirements as other revenues in the Conservation Fund. All expenditures and allocations of funds from this account shall be for the administration and implementation of the derelict crab trap removal program.

# (R.S. 56:650) §10.2. Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund

A.(1)(a) Subject to the exception contained in Article VII, Section 9(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, all funds collected by the commission under the provisions of this Part shall be credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. Out of the funds remaining in the Bond Security and Redemption Fund after a sufficient amount is allocated from that fund to pay all obligations secured by the full faith and credit of the state which become due and payable within any fiscal year, the treasurer shall deposit as provided in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection, an amount equal to the revenues collected under the provisions of this Part. The funds credited to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund shall be expended as provided in this Section.

(b) At any such time as the balance in the fund reaches twenty million dollars and a determination is made by the department that the fund contains

2	excess of twenty million dollars shall be credited to the Conservation Fund.
3	(2)(a) Of the revenues received from the issuance of each lifetime license
4	other than a senior lifetime license, one hundred dollars shall be credited to the
5	Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund, and the remaining funds shall be credited
6	to the Conservation Fund to be used for the purpose of administering and enforcing
7	the provisions of this Chapter or for such other purposes as may be determined by
8	the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries., in accordance with requirements of the
9	hunting and fishing or other special license fees that would have been required for
10	the hunting and fishing privileges covered by the provisions of R.S. 56:649.1, 649.2
11	<del>649.3, or 649.4.</del>
12	(b) Of the revenues received from the issuance of each senior lifetime
13	combination license, five dollars shall be credited to the Conservation Fund, and the
14	remaining revenues shall be credited to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund
15	(c) Of the revenues received from the additional gear license fees levied in
16	R.S. 56:649.3(B), one-tenth shall be deposited to the Conservation Fund to be used
17	by the department for its fiscal operations. The remaining nine-tenths of the revenues
18	collected shall be deposited to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund.
19	B.(1) The Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund is hereby established as
20	a public trust fund, the principal of which shall be invested at interest in perpetuity
21	and shall not be expended. The state treasurer shall, on a monthly basis, credit the
22	Conservation Fund with all interest revenues generated by investment of the
23	principal of the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund.
24	(2) The state treasurer shall credit to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust
25	Fund such additional funds as are received from private contributions, grants, and
26	donations made to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund.
27	C. The state treasurer shall invest the principal and the undistributed return
28	on the principal deposited in the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund for the

sufficient monies to be able to certify all lifetime license holders then those funds in

1	purpose of achieving perpetual financing of said fund. Such investments may
2	include, among others authorized by law the following:
3	(1) Equity investments in stocks, common and preferred, or corporations
4	listed on the New York Stock Exchange, the American Stock Exchange, or quoted
5	on the National Association of Securities Dealers Automated Quotations System,
6	provided that the total investment in such securities at any one time shall not exceed
7	thirty-five percent of the market value of all funds held by the fund. The treasurer
8	may hire, on a contract basis, investment managers or consultants as deemed
9	appropriate to provide for the equity investments of the fund. Such contracts shall
10	be on a fee, together with minimum exchange fee, basis or on a commission basis
11	only, with payment for such fees being appropriated from the fund.
12	(2) Direct general obligations of, or obligations on, which the timely payment
13	of the principal and interest is unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of
14	America.
15	(3) Bonds, debentures, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness issued by
16	any of the following agencies of the United States government: Government
17	National Mortgage Association; Rural Development Administration; Export-Import
18	Bank of the United States; Federal National Mortgage Association; Federal Home
19	Loan Mortgage Corporation; Federal Home Loan Bank; and Student Loan Marketing
20	Association.
21	(4) Bonds, debentures, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness issued by
22	any of the following agencies of the United States government, or any other like
23	governmental or government-sponsored agencies which are hereafter created,
24	including the Bank of Cooperatives, Federal Financing Bank, Small Business
25	Administration, and Bank for Reconstruction and Development.
26	(5) Investment grade commercial paper, investment grade corporate bonds,
27	and money market funds consisting solely of securities otherwise eligible for
28	investment by the treasurer pursuant to this Section.

1	SUDFART D-3. HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSING AND FEES
2	SUBPART A. RECREATIONAL LICENSES
3	§69.41. Recreational license requirements; definitions
4	A.(1) Any person over the age of sixteen years engaged in an activity that
5	involves hunting, fishing, or accessing department-owned property for which a
6	license is required shall have in their immediate possession a valid, original license,
7	or an effective license number, together with a form of personal identification, and
8	shall show such license and identification upon request to a duly authorized agent of
9	the department.
10	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of Paragraph (1) of this Subsection, any
11	person younger than sixteen years of age engaged in an activity that necessitates the
12	use of deer tags or turkey tags, or involves participation in a youth lottery hunt shall
13	have in their immediate possession a valid, original youth license and shall show
14	such license upon request to a duly authorized agent of the department.
15	B. Licenses shall be valid beginning June first of each calendar year and
16	expiring on June thirtieth of the following calendar year. Licenses may be issued
17	beginning June first of each year for the following license year. In the case where
18	an additional license or permit is required for a specific activity or for the taking or
19	possession of certain species of wildlife or fisheries resources, the basic or
20	prerequisite license must be valid in order for the additional license to be valid. No
21	license shall be assigned or transferred to, or used by, any person other than the
22	individual to whom the license was issued.
23	C. Any license found in the possession of a person other than the one to
24	whom the license was issued shall be confiscated by an officer authorized to enforce
25	the provisions of this Part and shall be delivered to the department for cancellation.
26	Any license confiscated under the provisions of this Section shall be considered void.
27	Any violation of this Subsection shall constitute a class three violation punishable
28	as provided in R.S. 56:33.

1	D. Each license shall be effective only during the open season for the
2	particular species of wildlife or fisheries resource authorized to be taken under the
3	provisions of the license.
4	E.(1) No resident license may be issued until valid proof of Louisiana
5	residency has been provided by the applicant. Residents shall meet the residency
6	requirements specified in R.S. 56:8 for bona fide residents.
7	(R.S. 301.2(A)(4)) (2) The issuance of a license is conditional upon
8	validation of all information on the application. If the department finds any material
9	misstatement of fact regarding the residency of the applicant, the license shall be
10	void and shall be immediately surrendered to an agent of the department.
11	F. In addition to a person who qualifies as a resident of Louisiana, the
12	following people qualify for resident licenses:
13	(1) (R.S. 56:643(B)(1)) Any person who possesses a military identification
14	card that signifies that he is currently on active military duty with any one of the
15	armed forces of the United States, including the National Guard, or the spouse or
16	dependent of such person, may be issued a license for hunting or recreational fishing
17	in Louisiana after payment of the same fee as that required of Louisiana residents for
18	that same license. Any license purchased under the provisions of this Subsection
19	shall be valid only during that time when the person is on active duty in the armed
20	forces of the United States. In addition, the provisions of this Subsection shall not
21	apply to the purchase of lifetime licenses. The military identification card or
22	dependent card and the appropriate license must be on the licensee's person at all
23	times when he is engaged in hunting or fishing activities.
24	(2) (R.S. 56:104(A) and 302.1(II)) A nonresident full-time student who is
25	enrolled in a Louisiana public or private high school or an accredited college or
26	university that has a physical campus in the state of Louisiana may purchase a
27	resident license. The applicant shall show a valid identification card issued by the
28	high school, college, or university indicating current full-time status and, when

1	engaged in the activity authorized by the license, must have both the license and the
2	school identification card on his person.
3	G. A person may quality for a Senior/Retired Military Hunting and Fishing
4	license as follows:
5	(1) A resident who reaches age sixty prior to June 1, 2000, may obtain an
6	annual Senior license for no cost.
7	(2) A resident who reaches age sixty between June 1, 2000, and May 31,
8	2019, may obtain an annual Senior Hunting and Fishing license for the cost of five
9	dollars.
10	(3) A resident who reaches age sixty-five on or after June 1, 2024, may
11	obtain an annual license at one-half the cost of an annual resident license.
12	(4) (R.S. 56:643(C)) Upon application to the department and showing
13	identification and proof of military service satisfactory to the department, any person
14	who is a retired member of the United States Armed Forces, the Louisiana Army
15	National Guard, or the Louisiana Air National Guard and was either born in
16	Louisiana or is a bona fide resident of Louisiana, may obtain an annual license at
17	one-half the cost of an annual resident license. shall be issued a retired military
18	hunting and fishing license. A fee of five dollars shall be charged for this license, and
19	the license shall be available from June first of each calendar year and shall be valid
20	from the date of purchase through the following June thirtieth. This license shall be
21	in lieu of basic hunting, big game, bow, primitive firearms, and waterfowl licenses,
22	turkey hunting stamps, WMA hunting permits, and the basic and saltwater fishing
23	licenses and must be in the possession of the licensee when the licensee is engaged
24	in hunting or fishing activities. Possession of this license shall also authorize the
25	license holder to use a crossbow or a bow that is drawn, held, and released by
26	mechanical means. Magnified scopes may be used with crossbows.
27	(R.S. 56:104(B)(2) and 302.2(B)) H. The following recreational fishermen,
28	upon Upon identification and proof of disability satisfactory to the department, the
29	following people shall be issued a basic recreational fishing license and saltwater

1	license without payment of any fees may be issued a Disabled/Special Needs
2	Hunting and Fishing license:
3	(1) A resident who is a veteran of the armed forces, the Louisiana Army
4	National Guard, or the Louisiana Air National Guard, having a permanent service
5	connected disability classification of fifty percent or more.
6	(2) A resident who is blind, paraplegic, or is a single or multiple amputee,
7	or is required to use one or more artificial limbs or permanent braces for mobility as
8	a result of a permanent and total disability.
9	(R.S. 56:104(A)(8)) (3) A resident who is totally and permanently disabled
10	and receiving a disability benefit from the federal social security system or a
11	disability retirement income from a retirement system whose members are exempt
12	from federal social security, either pursuant to the Railroad Retirement Insurance
13	Act, 45 U.S.C. §231, or because they are employees of a state or a political
14	subdivision of the state that has not voluntarily agreed to participate in federal social
15	security under 42 U.S.C. § 418. , may letter from the federal social security
16	administration or retirement system granting disability benefits shall be required at
17	time of purchase, along with proper identification, purchase a basic hunting license
18	which will also include a WMA hunting permit for a fee of five in order to hunt,
19	take, possess, or transport, wild birds and quadrupeds on which open seasons are
20	declared In addition to the basic hunting license fee, any such person may also
21	purchase a resident big game hunting license for a fee of five dollars, a resident bow
22	hunting license for a fee of five dollars, or a special primitive firearms license for a
23	fee of five dollars.
24	(R.S. 56:104(B) and 302.2(D)) (4) Any resident of Louisiana who is the
25	surviving spouse of a member of the United States Armed Forces, the Louisiana
26	Army National Guard, or the Louisiana Air National Guard who was killed in action
27	while in a combat zone, upon showing identification and documentation satisfactory
28	to the department. , shall be issued recreational and saltwater fishing licenses for a

total fee of two dollars and fifty cents.

(R.S. 56:103(F), 105 and 302.5) <u>I.</u> Any nonpublic authorized issuing agent that issues any license under the provisions of this <u>Section Subpart</u> may retain an amount not to exceed fifty cents of the fee collected from the sale of each <u>resident</u> and active duty military license issued <u>and an amount not to exceed one dollar from</u> the sale of each nonresident license issued. The amount to be retained shall be promulgated by the commission and the amount set by the commission shall be subject to the provisions of R.S. 56:94(B).

M.(1) The secretary may exempt for good cause persons or groups of people from the license fee requirements of this Part. Such exemption shall be in the form of a letter of permit from the secretary. The commission is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations that establish the criteria for such exemptions and that otherwise implement the provisions of this Subsection.

(R.S. 56:105(A)) (2) The department secretary may, in its his discretion and upon such terms and conditions as it he may prescribe, issue to accredited representatives of any public park, museum, educational or scientific institution, or of the federal government or any state government, recognized scientist, representative of the entertainment industry or to any other responsible person a permit to take, possess, and transport at any time within and from this state wild birds or the plumage, skins, nests, eggs, or young thereof and wild quadrupeds, the skins or young thereof; if the department secretary is satisfied that they are to be taken or possessed for scientific, educational, experimental, entertainment industry, or breeding purposes only and are not to be sold or otherwise disposed of by the permittee for profit, and if the permittee obligates himself to deliver to the department secretary within sixty days after taking, and in any event before the removal thereof from the state, a detailed descriptive inventory of the wild birds, wild quadrupeds, and other things taken under the permit.

(2) The commission shall establish for 2014 a special open deer hunting season on private property for Louisiana residents who are honorably discharged veterans of the United States Armed Forces. The commission may thereafter establish a special open deer hunting season for Louisiana residents who are honorably discharged veterans of the United States Armed Forces. The taking of deer in such a season shall be limited to a weekend prior to the opening weekend of the regular gun season in all of the applicable zones and shall run concurrently with the open deer hunting season for youth provided for in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection. The required saltwater angling license shall not preclude a person from fishing for freshwater species of fish south of the designated saltwater line described in R.S. 56:322(A) or in saltwater lakes and bodies of water designated in R.S. 56:322(B). A person may take or possess in such designated saltwater areas, without a saltwater angling license, any freshwater species of fish in any number not otherwise prohibited by law, provided the person possesses a valid fishing license as otherwise required by law. For the purpose of enforcement, the department shall determine by rule which species of fish shall be classified as a freshwater species and which shall be classified as a saltwater species. Any person, without a valid saltwater angling license, that takes a saltwater species of fish as classified by the department from a designated saltwater area shall return such fish immediately to the waters from which taken without avoidable injury. An enforcement agent or officer of the department may inspect a fisherman's eatch to insure compliance with this Paragraph.
- D. A person may take or possess a freshwater species of fish while in the saltwater areas designated by R.S. 56:322(B) without the necessity of a saltwater license. The commission shall promulgate by rule the species of fish classified as

freshwater species. While in saltwater areas, a person possessing fish other than
those designated as freshwater species shall be required to possess either a saltwater
fishing license or an equivalent license that grants both basic and saltwater fishing
privileges. Any species of fish that is required to be returned to the water shall be
returned immediately to the water without avoidable injury from which it was taken.
An enforcement agent or officer of the department may inspect a fisherman's catch

The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, through its secretary, may, in addition to the issuance of annual individual hunting and fishing licenses and in order to facilitate the distribution of sport hunting and fishing licenses as provided in this Chapter, provide for the issuance of hunting or fishing licenses, or the Wild Louisiana Stamp, on a three year basis, exclusive of any other special licenses otherwise authorized by law. The secretary shall promulgate rules and regulations to effectuate the provisions of this Section.
