12	§427.3. Teach Louisiana First Program; purpose; eligibility criteria; incentive
13	payments; reports; administration; funding
14	A. * * *
15	B.(1)(a) The program shall provide for the payment, pursuant to a contract
16	with the Louisiana Student Financial Assistance Commission office of student
17	financial assistance, referred to in this Section as the "administering agency," of
18	incentive pay to highly qualified teachers who are employed by city, parish, or other
19	local public school boards, referred to in this Section as a "school board," selected
20	by the state Department of Education, referred to in this Section as the "department,"
21	pursuant to standards established by the state board, all as provided in this Section.
22	* * *
23	F.(1) The program shall be administered by the Louisiana Student Financial
24	Assistance Commission office of student financial assistance which shall
25	promulgate rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure
26	Act for the implementation of the program.
27	* * *
28	§3021. Louisiana office of student financial assistance; Board of Regents
29	The Board of Regents Office of Student Financial Assistance, hereafter

1	referred to in this Chapter as the board office, shall supervise, control, direct, and
2	administer state and federal programs to provide loans to assist persons in meeting
3	the expenses of higher education, and state and federal scholarship programs for
4	higher education in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter and Chapter 50
5	of this Title. The office shall be advised by the Louisiana Trust Authority,
6	<u>created in R.S. 17:3093.</u>
7	§3023. Powers and duties
8	A. The board office may:
9	(1) Guarantee the loan of money to lending agencies and/or any holders of
10	such loans, subject to the requirement of R.S. 17:3023.4 and upon such other terms
11	and conditions as the board office may prescribe, for persons attending or planning
12	to attend institutions of higher education to assist them in meeting their expenses of
13	higher education, including graduate, professional, vocational, business, or technical
14	education.
15	(2)(a) Pay to the lending agencies or any holders of such loans the interest as
16	prescribed in R.S. 17:3023.4 on loans made to students as long as the student is
17	enrolled in any postsecondary education institution approved by the board office or
18	for not in excess of three years during which the borrower is in the active military
19	service of the United States.
20	(b) When federal funds are available to refund the board office for payment
21	of interest on student loans, periodic installment payments of principal may be
22	delayed, and interest may accrue and may be paid during any period:
23	* * *
24	(3) Operate in the other capacities permitted by federal law and regulation in
25	the Title IV student financial assistance programs administered by the commission
26	<u>office</u> .
27	(4) Reject or take or hold and administer, on behalf of the board office and
28	for any of its purposes, real property, personal property, and monies, or any interest
29	therein, and the income therefrom, either absolutely or in trust, for any purpose of

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the board <u>office</u>. The board <u>office</u> may invest its funds in any investments in which funds of the state employees retirement system may be invested pursuant to R.S. 11:517. The board <u>office</u> may acquire property or monies for its purposes by the acceptance of gifts, grants, appropriations, bequests, devises, or loans.

(5) Enter into such contracts, as may be desirable, with institutions of higher education, upon such terms as may be agreed upon between the board office and the institution, to provide for the administration by such institution of any loan or loan plan guaranteed by the board office, including but not limited to applications therefor and repayment thereof.

10 (6) Enter into contracts with any bank or other lending agency or any holder 11 of such loan upon such terms as may be agreed upon between the board office and 12 the bank or other lending agency or holder, to provide for the administration by such 13 bank or other lending agency or holder, of any loan or loan plan guaranteed by the commission office including but not limited to applications therefor and terms of 14 repayment thereof, and to establish the conditions for payment by the board office 15 16 to the bank or other lending agency or the holder of the guarantee on any loan. A loan shall be defaulted when the bank or other lending agency or holder makes 17 18 application to the board office for payment on the loan stating that such loan is in 19 default in accordance with the terms of a contract executed under this Paragraph.

(7) Sue and be sued in the name of the board office.

21 (8) Collect loans guaranteed by the board office on which the board office
22 has met its guarantee obligations.

(9) Adopt rules and regulations in accordance with the provisions of the
Administrative Procedure Act, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Chapter,
governing the guarantee, disbursement, or servicing of loans made by the board
office and governing any other matters relating to the activities of the board office.
Such rules and regulations shall include procedures for the denial of licenses,
permits, and certificates required by the state to practice or engage in a trade,
occupation, or profession to applicants and renewal applicants in default on the

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1	repayment of loans guaranteed by the board office, for the conditional issuance or
2	renewal of such a license, permit, or certificate pending an applicant's compliance
3	with loan repayment requirements, and for other matters necessary to implement the
4	provisions of R.S. 37:2951.
5	* * *
6	B. In addition to any other powers and duties authorized by this Section, the
7	board office shall establish an internal audit function and shall establish an office of
8	the chief audit executive who shall be responsible for ensuring that the internal audit
9	function adheres to the Institute of Internal Auditors, International Standards for the
10	Professional Practice of Internal Auditing. The chief audit executive shall maintain
11	organizational independence in accordance with these standards and shall have direct
12	and unrestricted access to the board office. The chief audit executive shall annually
13	certify to the board office that the internal audit function conforms to the Institute of
14	Internal Auditors, International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal
15	Auditing.
16	§3023.1. Credit unions, savings and loan associations, schools and insurance
17	companies as lending agencies
18	* * *
19	C. Savings and loan associations in Louisiana shall be empowered to make
20	student loans guaranteed by the board office up to five percent of their assets in
21	accordance with the provisions of any federal law relating to federally insured
22	student loan programs.
23	D. Postsecondary schools in Louisiana shall be empowered to make student
24	loans guaranteed by the board office in accordance with the provisions of the Federal
25	Higher Education Act of 1965 as amended or as hereafter amended.
26	E. Insurance companies domiciled, licensed, or registered to do business and
27	subject to examination and supervision by an agency of the state shall be empowered
28	to make student loans guaranteed by the board office pursuant to the provisions of
29	applicable state laws and the provisions of the Federal Higher Education Act of

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1965, as amended or hereafter amended.

§3023.3. Loan of reserve funds

The board office may authorize the granting of guaranteed student loans made pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter out of reserve funds available to the board office for such purpose, and may sell or discount, or both, such loans to banks, credit unions, and other authorized lending institutions, at such consideration and upon such terms as may be agreed upon by the board office.

8 §3023.4. Student loan guarantees

9 A. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the board office may 10 guarantee loans made to students attending or planning to attend institutions of 11 higher education, including graduate, professional, vocational, business, or technical 12 education, subject to the conditions, limitations, reinsurance provisions and in 13 accordance with the terms and provisions of and within the amounts established by 20 U.S.C. §1071 et seq., or in accordance with the provisions of any federal law or 14 regulations relating to student loan guarantee or insurance programs, provided that 15 16 the aggregate value of all loans guaranteed and outstanding at any one time shall not exceed fifteen times the total value of funds, investments, properties, and other assets 17 available to the board office for such purpose, except that this guarantee may be 18 19 further expanded by use of federal credit.

§3023.6. Loan qualification; legal capacity

22 Any person otherwise qualifying for a loan guaranteed by the board office shall not be disqualified by reason of his being under the age of twenty-one, and for 23 24 the purpose of applying for, receiving, and repaying such a loan, any such person, notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary, shall be deemed to have 25 full legal capacity to act and shall have all the rights, powers, privileges, and 26 27 obligations of a person of full age with respect thereto.

- §3023.7. Tax exemption 28
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All property and income of the board office used exclusively for the purposes

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1	of this Chapter shall be exempt from all taxes and assessments.
2	§3023.8. Examination by commissioner of financial institutions
3	The board office in its actions pursuant to this Chapter is subject to
4	examination by the commissioner of financial institutions, but shall not be deemed
5	to be a banking organization nor be required to pay a fee for any such supervision or
6	examination. The board office shall make an annual report of its condition to the
7	governor, the legislature, and the commissioner of financial institutions on or before
8	June thirtieth.
9	§3024. Acceptance and use of funds
10	The board office shall accept any contributions or subsidies made to it from
11	state funds and shall use the funds to meet administrative expenses for any of its
12	purposes and to provide a reserve fund to guarantee loans made pursuant to the
13	provisions of this Chapter and to pay interest on guaranteed loans, as provided by
14	R.S. 17:3023.
15	§3024.1. Student loans as security for deposit of public funds
16	Notes representing loans to students which are guaranteed by this board
17	office in accordance with a contract agreement under the provisions of this Chapter,
18	may be pledged as collateral security for deposit of public funds as required in R.S.
19	39:1221.
20	§3024.2. Appropriation for guaranteed student loan program
21	The legislature shall annually appropriate sufficient funds to pay those
22	eligible claims resulting from the guarantee of student loans by the board office
23	under this Chapter, but only to the extent that anticipated federal reinsurance or
24	reimbursement payments pursuant to 20 U.S.C. §1071 et seq., and any other monies
25	available to the board office for such purpose are insufficient to pay such claims.
26	§3031. State student incentive grant; federal participation
27	A. The board office may administer the state student incentive grant program
28	for student financial aid as provided in Title IV of the Federal Higher Education Act,
29	as amended, and to prescribe appropriate rules and regulations applicable thereto.

B. The board office may implement a program to train and further acquaint 4 5 administrators of financial aid and assistance with the federal and state programs of student financial aid, pursuant to the Federal Higher Education Act as amended. The 6 7 board office shall design and develop this program in consultation with the statewide 8 financial aid administrators association. The board office may provide appropriate 9 rules and regulations in order to execute this provision. The board office may enter 10 into contracts or agreements with the federal government for their financial 11 participation in the program on such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon by 12 the board office.

\$3041.10. Tuition payment program for medical students; Louisiana State

16A. The Louisiana Student Financial Assistance Commission office of student17financial assistance, hereinafter referred to as "the commission office," shall provide18for and administer a tuition payment program for students who meet all of the19following eligibility criteria:

21 §3041.12. Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center; contracts

The commission office shall enter into such contracts for students who have been admitted to the medical school, and the money obligations of such contract as made by the commission office with the medical school shall be paid for out of funds to be provided in accordance with law for such purposes.

26 §3041.13. Cancellation

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The commission <u>office</u> shall have authority to cancel any contract made between it and any applicant upon cause deemed sufficient by the commission <u>office</u>, and the commission <u>office</u> shall have authority to cancel such contracts which it may

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1	lawfully cancel made with any of the schools as herein provided.
2	§3041.21. Tuition payment program for medical students; Tulane University
3	School of Medicine; eligibility; applications; definition
4	A. The Louisiana Student Financial Assistance Commission office of student
5	financial assistance, hereinafter referred to as "the commission office," shall provide
6	for and administer a tuition payment program for students who meet all of the
7	following eligibility criteria:
8	* * *
9	§3041.22. Contracts
10	The applicant shall enter into a contract with the state of Louisiana, agreeing
11	to the terms and conditions upon which the tuition shall be paid, and such contract
12	shall be prepared, approved, and signed by the chairman of the commission office
13	and shall be signed by the applicant. If the applicant fails to abide by the terms of the
14	contract, the applicant shall be responsible for full and immediate payment in an
15	amount equal to double the amount of any tuition paid on his behalf through the
16	program, and the commission office shall take all necessary steps to secure collection
17	of the payment.
18	§3041.23. Tulane University School of Medicine; contracts
19	The commission office shall enter into such contracts for students who have
20	been admitted to the medical school, and the money obligations of any such contract
21	as made by the commission office with the medical school shall be paid for out of
22	funds to be provided in accordance with law for such purposes.
23	§3041.24. Cancellation
24	The commission office shall have authority to cancel any contract made
25	between it and any applicant upon cause deemed sufficient by the commission office,
26	and the commission office shall have authority to cancel such contracts which it may
27	lawfully cancel made with the Tulane University School of Medicine and any of the
28	schools as herein provided.
29	§3041.26. Rules and regulations

1	The commission office shall prescribe such rules and regulations as it deems
2	necessary and proper to implement the provisions of this Chapter.
3	§3042.1. Loans for students enrolled in colleges or universities to prepare to teach
4	A.(1) In addition to all other powers and duties of the Louisiana Student
5	Financial Assistance Commission office of student financial assistance, the
6	commission office may make loans to a student who meets all of the following
7	requirements:
8	* * *
9	(f) Meets such other qualifications as the commission office may prescribe
10	by rule.
11	(2) The commission <u>office</u> also may make loans to a student who meets the
12	requirements of any one of the following Subparagraphs:
13	(a) Meets the requirements of Subparagraphs (1)(a) and (b) of this
14	Subsection, has successfully completed not less than forty-eight credit hours of
15	academic course work from an accredited college or university, has a cumulative
16	grade point average on such course work of at least 3.00 calculated on a 4.00 scale,
17	and meets such other qualifications as the commission office may prescribe by rule.
18	(b) Meets the requirements of Subparagraphs (1)(a) and (b) of this
19	Subsection, has a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university, has
20	a cumulative undergraduate grade point average of at least 3.00 calculated on a 4.00
21	scale, and meets such other qualifications as the commission office may prescribe
22	by rule.
23	(c) Meets the requirements of Subparagraphs (1)(a) and (b) of this
24	Subsection, has at least a master's degree from an accredited college or university,
25	and meets such other qualifications as the commission office may prescribe by rule.
26	B. The authority of the commission office to make loans to persons eligible
27	as provided in this Chapter shall be exercised in accordance with and be subject to
28	the provisions of this Chapter.
29	C. The commission office may make a loan to a student whom it deems to be

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- qualified, upon such terms and conditions as the commission <u>office</u> may impose in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter, provided the student intends to acquire a degree from a program approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education pursuant to R.S. 17:7.2 which leads to a degree in education or intends to pursue an alternative program which leads to regular certification as a teacher as provided by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.
- 7 D. Any student to whom the commission office has made a loan shall be 8 required to maintain a cumulative college grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 9 scale at the conclusion of each academic year and to enter a program approved by 10 the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education pursuant to R.S. 17:7.2 11 which leads either to a degree in education or to regular certification as a teacher as 12 soon as the student has earned sufficient credits to do so. If at any time a student 13 who is receiving a loan fails to maintain the cumulative grade point average required by this Chapter for continued eligibility for this program or is placed on academic 14 probation by the college or university he attends, he shall be ineligible for additional 15 16 loans under this Chapter. The commission office may resume making loans as provided in this Chapter when and if a student regains the cumulative grade point 17 average required by this Chapter for continuing eligibility and is no longer on 18 19 academic probation, provided that the period of ineligibility did not persist for more than two years from the date of loss of eligibility. The commission office, by rule, 20 may provide that a loan made to a student who leaves school for reasons specified 21 by rule may be continued at the discretion of the commission office. 22
- E. It shall be the duty of the Louisiana Student Financial Assistance
 Commission, hereinafter referred to in this Chapter as "the commission", office of
 student financial assistance to:
- F. The commission <u>office</u> may prescribe such rules and regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry out the purposes of this Chapter.
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§3042.2. Amount; requirements

2 A.(1) A loan may be made by the commission office pursuant to this Chapter for not in excess of four thousand dollars per undergraduate year for up to eight 3 4 semesters or the equivalent of eight semesters at schools operating on a different 5 schedule for any approved applicant who intends to acquire a degree in education from a program approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary 6 Education as provided in R.S. 17:3042.1(C), provided such loan is used to defray the 7 8 tuition and other expenses of any such applicant at a public or commission-approved 9 office-approved independent college or university in Louisiana.

10 (2) A loan may be made by the commission office pursuant to this Chapter 11 for not in excess of six thousand dollars per undergraduate year for up to eight 12 semesters or the equivalent of eight semesters at schools operating on a different 13 schedule for any approved applicant who intends to acquire a degree in either the area of mathematics or chemistry and who intends to pursue an alternative program 14 which leads to regular certification as a teacher as provided in R.S. 17:3042.1(C), 15 16 provided such loan is used to defray the tuition and other expenses of any such applicant at a public or commission-approved office-approved independent college 17 or university in Louisiana. 18

19 B. A loan made under the provisions of this Chapter to any applicant shall not exceed the amount provided in this Chapter, and shall be under such terms and 20 conditions as may be provided under rules and regulations of the commission office. 21

C. A student for whom a loan is made by the commission office pursuant to 22 the provisions of this Chapter shall be required to repay the full amount of the loan 23 24 and interest thereon to the commission office. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the commission office shall forgive such a loan to the applicant in return for services 25 rendered by the applicant by practicing his or her profession as a classroom teacher 26 27 in the elementary or secondary schools of the state. One year's funding of the loan together with the interest thereon shall be forgiven by the commission office for the 28 29 applicant for each year of practicing his profession in any elementary or secondary

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1	school in Louisiana.
2	§3042.3. Contract required; cancellation
3	A. Before the commission office of student financial assistance makes a
4	loan for an applicant, the applicant shall enter into a contract with the Louisiana
5	Student Financial Assistance Commission office, agreeing to the terms and
6	conditions upon which the loan shall be made, which said contract shall include such
7	terms and provisions as will carry out the full purpose and intent of this Chapter.
8	The form for the contract shall be prepared and approved by the attorney general and
9	shall be signed by such officer or employee of the commission office as the
10	commission office shall designate, and shall be signed by the applicant.
11	B.(1) The obligation of the applicant to repay a loan pursuant to the
12	provisions of this Chapter shall remain in effect until the applicant has repaid the
13	loan and the interest thereon as provided in this Chapter or the commission office has
14	forgiven the loan, all in accordance with the terms of the contract with the applicant
15	for the loan.
16	(2) Upon breach of any terms of the contract by the applicant, or for any
17	cause deemed sufficient by the commission office, the remaining amount of the loan
18	paid to the applicant which the commission office has not forgiven in return for
19	service shall become due and payable by the applicant in accordance with the terms
20	of the contract between the commission <u>office</u> and the applicant and the commission
21	office shall take all necessary steps to secure collection.
22	C. The commission office is hereby vested with full and complete authority
23	and power to sue in its own name any applicant for any balance due on a loan made
24	by the commission <u>office</u> .
25	* * *
26	§3042.4. Colleges and universities; contracts; cancellation
27	A. The commission office may make inquiry of the colleges and universities
28	of Louisiana, make such arrangements and enter into such contracts or agreements
29	with institutions of higher education in the state as shall be appropriate to carry out

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1	the provisions of this Chapter. Such contracts and agreements shall include such
2	provisions as shall be agreed upon by the commission office and the institution to
3	provide for the administration by the institution of loans made pursuant to the
4	provisions of this Chapter, including applications therefor and repayment thereof.
5	Such contracts and agreements shall be approved by the attorney general.
6	B. The commission office shall have authority to cancel such contracts and
7	agreements, which it may lawfully cancel, made with any of the colleges or
8	universities as herein provided.
9	* * *
10	§3042.6. Reports
11	The commission office shall make an annual report to the legislature of its
12	activities under the provisions of this Chapter.
13	* * *
14	§3042.7. Louisiana Teacher Corps
15	A. * * *
16	B.(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, the commission
17	office shall forgive any loan made to an applicant in return for services rendered by
18	the applicant by practicing his profession as a classroom teacher in an elementary or
19	secondary school which is located in an economically disadvantaged region of the
20	state as shall be defined by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.
21	Two year's funding of the loan together with the interest thereon shall be forgiven
22	by the commission office for the applicant for each year of practicing his profession
23	in an elementary or secondary school in an economically disadvantaged region of
24	Louisiana.
25	* * *
26	§3042.52. Loans for certain nursing students; Louisiana Student Financial
27	Assistance Commission office of student financial assistance;
28	authority
29	A. The Louisiana Student Financial Assistance Commission office of student

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1	financial assistance, hereinafter referred to as "the commission office," may with
2	the use of funds appropriated for such purpose, make loans to a student who meets
3	all of the requirements in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection and any one of the
4	requirements in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection:
5	(1)(a) Is a bona fide citizen and resident of the state. However, first priority
6	shall be given to students who have been residents of the state for at least two years.
7	(b) Meets such other qualifications as the commission office may prescribe
8	by rule.
9	* * *
10	B. The commission office may make a loan to a student who it deems to be
11	qualified, upon such terms and conditions as the commission office may impose in
12	accordance with the provisions of this Chapter, provided the student intends to
13	acquire a degree or diploma from a program approved by the Louisiana State Board
14	of Nursing or the Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners which leads
15	to a degree or diploma in licensed practical nursing or registered nursing or leads to
16	a degree which qualifies such individual to teach nursing.
17	C. Any student to whom the commission office has made a loan shall be
18	required to maintain all requirements set forth by the college, university, or nursing
19	school such student is attending.
20	D. It shall be the duty of the commission office to do all of the following:
21	* * *
22	E. The commission office may prescribe such rules and regulations as it
23	deems necessary and proper to carry out the purposes of this Chapter which shall

Additionally provides for the office of financial assistance to perform functions the functions of the state related to programs of financial assistance and certain scholarship programs for higher education.

Present law provides for the Louisiana Tuition Trust authority, provides for the membership of the authority, and places that authority under the governance of the Board of Regents.
