7	Section 1. The introductory paragraph of R.S. 46:56(F) and (7)(a) are hereby
8	amended and reenacted to read as follows:

12	F. The following information shall not be subject to waiver and shall not be
13	released to applicants, recipients, or outside sources, except those outside sources
14	engaged in the administration of the programs of the department or when

1	former foster child or his legal tutor, the information described in Paragraph (1)
2	of this Subsection to the former foster child <u>, or</u> his legal tutor <u>, or to a designee who</u>
3	is engaged in rendering services, treatment, or an assessment of services
4	previously provided to the child, if in its discretion it believes the release of such
5	information to be in the best interest of the former foster child. Such information
6	shall not include any information regarding the identity of the birth parents or birth
7	siblings of a former foster child who was subsequently adopted or any information
8	regarding the identity of the reporter in a case of abuse or neglect.

10	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
11	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
12	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
13	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
14	effective on the day following such approval.

<u>Present law</u> provides that certain information regarding child welfare shall not be released to applicants, recipients, or outside sources. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides for exceptions to allow certain information to be released when a former foster child or his legal tutor consent. <u>Proposed law</u> adds a provider of treatment or services, or one who is reviewing past services, as a party authorized to receive information from a case record.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
